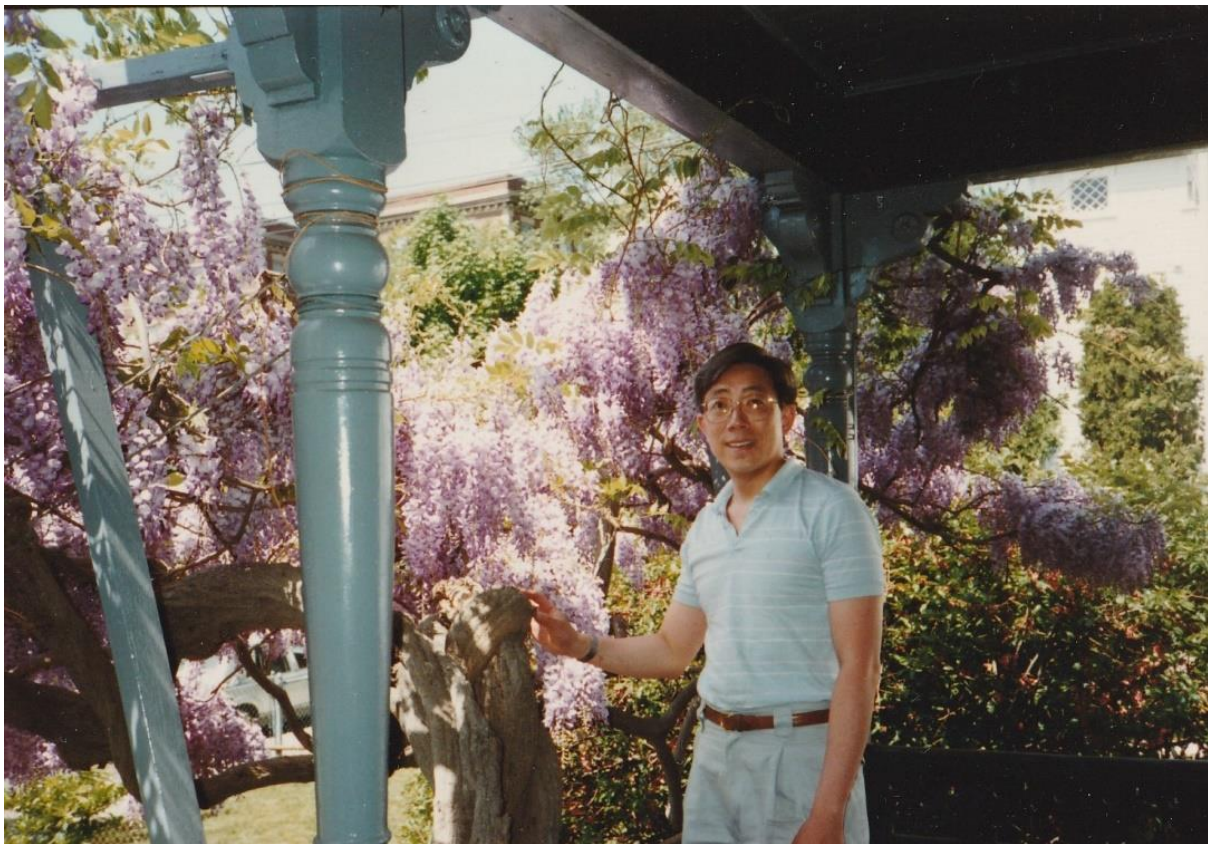


Through years we had encountered difficulties to manage long drooping racemes over our front entrance steps. During visiting couple private gardens near Boston and travelling through Japan last many years, we had learned from numerous garden experts that wisteria plants need pergola with sufficient height.

This was the very first beautiful wisteria pergola that I had noticed in a private garden near Boston, MA



This following picture was taken 30 years ago around 1992-1993, the original trellis for the Japanese wisteria was cantilevered from each front columns of the wraparound porch and mounted at about 10'-4" height from ground.



The following pictures were taken on 10/15/2022 - to illustrate that the original cantilever trellis mounting height for the Japanese wisteria was 124" = 10' - 4" from ground as indicated in the above picture.



Through last 30 years at home hard lessons learned from taking care of Japanese wisteria, research findings and knowledge learned from experienced Professional garden experts, horticulturists and botanists – the old cantilever wisteria trellis' height was right, but the cantilevered arms of the trellis were way too short to allow the Japanese wisteria to have a healthy growth with long drooping racemes!

Therefore, the constructed 10' - 4" sufficient height landscape pergola for the existing old Japanese wisteria is needed - to allow and to provide a healthy natural growth opportunity by using this functional supporting pergola for longevity!
