## Hello,

The Department of Mobility has requested members of the SCPD provide technical comments regarding intersection improvements over the next two years. They are looking for any **technical comments** (i.e. moving curb ramps) **by February 1**. Currently, they have not recommended any specific parking regulation changes where there are parking impacts. Mobility will be able to make those recommendations closer to the start of construction and welcome comments to that later if needed. Similar feedback from PTAC and SBAC is also being requested to pull together before the Mobility team finalizes plans with the consultant. For a bit of background on this program, a main action item in the Mobility Vision Zero plan is to redesign unsafe intersections that have larger vehicle volumes, located on streets that experience a high number of crashes, and have public transit service. Mobility has also looked at locations that are a significant gap in the pedestrian network and reviewed community feedback heard in street outreach, surveys, 311 service requests and constituent emails. Mobility was able to move forward with new designs for 5 locations and plan to construct those changes over 2024 to 2025.
