Focus: Development 101 (40 minutes)

- Includes how Mobility interfaces with developers, transit zoning, parking regulations, and more.
- Governed by Somerville Zoning Ordinance (SZO)
- Hybrid: Form and Use-based zoning (Form of land and shape); Use used building
- Intent includes a number of mobility-focused intents
- City split into 19 districts largely form-based
- Has transit areas ¼ mile of transit station
- Within transit areas set max parking, outside set parking minimums,
- Bike parking divided into short-term (for visitors), longer-term = security

- By-Right Projects
- Projects that require.
- Most permits are administrative permits.
- Site Plan Approval includes Transit Action Plan and Transportation Impact Study (TIS) includes methodologies for measuring impact of development.
- SZO changes can be proposed by Mayor, property owners, 10+ city residents or individual Councilors, voted on and improved by full City Council.
