Following are the questions received, and answers provided for IFB 24-56 Removal and Disposal of Street Sweeping Debris:

Q1. How many total tons of Street Sweeping debris were disposed of during the period from June 2021 through the end of 2023 for the City of Somerville?

A1. 5,590.03 tons.

- **Q2.** Can you provide the names and locations of the disposal sites where this Street Sweeping debris was dumped during the same time period?
- **A2.** Lynch Construction Disposal Site in Wilmington has closed therefore it needs to be transported to Nashua, NH to an alternate Lynch Site.
- **Q3.** Are sweepings to be loaded into the contractor's trucks/trailers by Somerville DPW personnel using Somerville DPW equipment?
