Draft Letter Discussion: Elm Street Parking Pilot (30 Minutes)

- Mobility is proposing changes to parking regulations on Elm Street between Davis Square and Grove Street. These changes aim to encourage safe and legal parking, meet the high demand for quick pickup and drop-off, increase the number of accessible spaces, provide adequate space for truck loading and unloading, and increase safety for all users (especially people using the crosswalks). City Update & Discussion: Latest Proposed Designs for Tufts Street (30 Minutes)

- Mobility has prepared an updated proposed design for Tufts Street based on community feedback. At this meeting, Mobility will present the updated design and seek committee input.
- In the <u>Tufts Street Reconstruction project</u>, the City is planning to reconstruct sidewalks and repave Tufts Street in East Somerville between Cross Street and Washington Street. As part of the effort, the City is planning to redesign Tufts Street as a <u>Neighborway</u> to make it safer and more comfortable for people using all modes.
