 - Biking the extent of the project and stopping to talk about existing conditions or future hopes
 - Annual Bicyclist/Pedestrian Counts

- Coordinated by Lilly
- General call has gone out for first time participants (with special training), full call for all participants going out next week
- Count period is 9/24 10/4 (Tu/W/Th over two weeks), morning & evening shifts for each location
- 7:30am 8:30am & 5pm-6pm
- 42 Locations, some have been split into two sides to account for volume
- Scooters are a new category to capture
- E-bikes (Class I/II) counted as regular bicycles
- Tom How does splitting scooters out compare to last year?
 - O They should have been counted as "Other" last year
- Tom Volunteer group (Boston Cyclists Union) may have interest in helping with data visualization, has the City worked with them?

 - Greg Not as part of this project, do work closely with SomerStat (City Data Warehouse) for data & visualization, all prior year data is available online
- Ted Are we doing demographics?
 - O No, it was too hard and too many assumptions to collect valid data

Focus: Establishing subcommittees (30-40 minutes)

- Discuss how the previous subcommittees were set up
 - With new members joining the SBAC is interested in re-establishing sub-committees to focus on specific areas of interest as was done in the past
 - o "The 5 E's"
 - Engineering
 - Evaluation
 - Encouragement
 - Education
 - Enforcement
 - Equity (was sort of split across all sub committees)
 - Procedurally sub-committees may meet without triggering Open Meeting Law as long as they remain below Committee quorum (currently 6 members)
 - This allows impromptu meetings to heavily focus on one area and bring recommendations back to the full committee for votes or other actions
 - o Engineering & Evaluation is the only active sub-committee, currently run by Ted
 - Focus on feedback about technical/engineering plans during early stages of a project
 - Welcome all members regardless of background
 - Would bring specific actions back to the full committee for a full vote to recommend changes to a project
 - One example is helping the City prioritize the new Somerville Bicycle Network Plan to align with community needs
 - Enforcement
 - Used to try and work with SPD, had mixed success depending on SPD leadership being cyclists themselves
 - Committee members learned a lot about why SPD chose focus areas though struggled to change them in a progressive manner which led to burnout of committee members
- Brainstorm new subcommittee structure
 - Engineering & Eval
 - Reviewing Plans
 - Advising/suggestion new solutions
 - Alex Is this still focused on data gathering like parking inventories in new project areas?
 - Yes!

- Lena Much of the work the committee used to focus on is now done in-house by an expanded Mobility Department
- Encouragement
 - Rides
 - Bike-Bus
 - School/Kid-Focus
 - Do we have any information on previous work here?
 - Who from the City can we talk to about this?
 - City has a Safe Routes to School staff group
 - o Talk to Mobility, they can connect with SPS & other OSPCD Teams
 - Bike Repair
 - Advocacy
 - The old Education & Encouragement Sub Committee was pretty robust
 - Covered lots of education components
 - Filmed a "How to use a bike box" video with Somerville Community TV
 - Tried setting up the 5th grade learn to bike before COVID
 - Educational fliers about how to use new bicycle infrastructure (for cyclists, motorists & pedestrians)
 - Coffee talks?
 - Meet up at a coffeeshop near bicycle infrastructure
 - Run like office hours to get more community engagement
- o Media/Outreach
 - Police
 - Political
 - Interacting with elected officials, cannot interact with candidates during an election (outside of incumbents' official roles)
 - Letters in support of grants to State/Federal agencies
 - Letters in support to projects in other cities
 - Newsletter
 - Social Media
 - Walkthroughs of projects (before or after)
 - Parking removal buy-in from Ward City Councilor
 - Outreach has been very lacking since COVID and we would love to see more!
 - Much of outreach is a lot of work and requires a team effort, not one or two members!
 - Could work with Traffic & Parking to put bicycle fliers in parking permit mailers
 - Is there any possibility of City Staff (Mobility) working on bicycle-specific newsletters?
 - Does the City feel that there are gaps in their newsletters that need SBAC to write our own?
 - O Committee work is not captured in City newsletters today
 - Should SBAC write a segment for a City newsletter?
 - Committee should focus a newsletter on outreach & encouragement, not on City projects
 - PTAC has a newsletter that has some overlap but also covers committee-specific business
- o All of the sub committees should be interacting with each other, there is significant overlap!
- How do we move this conversation forward?
 - Need sub-committee chairs
 - o ACTION: For the Committee
 - Executive committee will collect feedback from members and share before the October meeting
 - Members interested in leading a sub-committee should make their interest known to the executive committee
 - o Committee will vote on sub-committees in October

 - Structural work continues
 - o McGrath Blvd
 - Advanced towards 25% milestone
 - o Davis Sq
 - Limited mill/pave and restriping work in late 2024
 - Western Washington St
 - Sidewalk / crosswalk / bike facility construction continues
 - Project scheduled for completion late 2024
 - Can the City get better construction traffic details during the morning school rush?
 - o Tufts St
 - Reviewing feedback from summer community engagement
 - West Broadway
 - Fall 2024 plan update & public feedback period
 - Late 2024/Early 2025 final plans
 - o Glen St/Otis St Neighborways
 - Added in August
 - Paint & symbols underway
 - Walnut St Two Way Bike Facility
 - Green bike crossings to Gilman St added
 - o Tufts St Mural
 - Completed
