



# What is Jobs Linkage Funding?

### Jobs Linkage Funding

- \$2.99 per square foot fee on commercial real estate development projects over 15,000 square feet
- Fees are paid in two phases: 50% due at building permit and 50% due at certificate of occupancy.
- Annual fee adjustment based on Boston Consumer Price Index (CPI)

\$2.93 in 2023



\$2.99 in 2024

## What can JCRT funds be used for?\*

- Development and creation of Job training and skill development opportunities for Somerville residents
- Outreach to identify populations facing barriers to employment
- Tools and software to identify and assess residents' skills/match residents with available local jobs
- Equipment and other capital costs related to non-profit/public job training and education
- Seed money for new programs or organizations
- High school and career technical education programs



# What can JCRT funds be used for? (continued)\*

- Help employers improve high road business practices with innovative models such as worker-owned coops
- Professional development and training for non-profit and education providers
- Capacity building

- Other programs/projects that assist in creation and maintenance of employment opportunities for Somerville residents in and near Somerville

#### JCRT Contributions by Fiscal Year Total: \$5.4M




### Projected Funding Picture



## What has the JCRT funded?: Adult Education

(Strategies 1,3,&4)

- Contextualized English Class for Speakers of other languages (ESOL)
- Adult Basic Education/High School Equivalency
- Digital Literacy Training Resources
- Stipends for participants

Outcomes (2020 - Summer 2024)

**580+** residents received adult education services

Majority of participants continuing education or career development at SCALE, Middlesex CC, Bunker Hill CC, Franklin Cummings Tech, and other institutions

## What has the JCRT funded?: Industry specific job training

(Strategies 1, 3, & 4)

- Banking and Finance
- Biomedical Careers
- Building Maintenance and Clean Energy
- Cannabis Careers
- Information Technology
- Stipends for participants and CORI expungement services







## Outcomes (2020-Present)

**100+** Residents trained in high-demand industries

**70+** residents have attained better jobs

**\$8.91/hour** Average Wage Gain

# What has the JCRT funded?: Wage Theft and Workers' Rights Training (Strategy 2)

- Know Your Rights (KYR) Workshops
- Train the Trainer Leadership Institute
- Workplace Issues Case Support

#### Outcomes (2020-2022)

- 255 Somerville workers trained in KYR Workshops
- 29 Leadership Institute graduates
- 51 workplaces issues cases resolved or referred


