

Project Background




Limit of Work



Broadway from Clarendon Ave to Alewife Brook Pkwy (Route 16).


Pavement and Sidewalk Management Program


- <u>Data-driven pavement management program</u> to maintain and improve our roadways and sidewalks managed by Infrastructure and Asset Management (IAM)
- Selected streets are categorized by project type:
 - Complete Street and Intersection Projects
 - Full Street Projects
 - Sidewalk Only Projects
 - Curb to Curb Paving Projects
 - Partial Paving Projects
- Western Broadway is designated in the paving program to be reconstructed as a Complete Street.

Existing Conditions

- Widespread sidewalk and pavement deterioration
- Sub-standard crossing conditions
- Lack of bicycle infrastructure



- Blocks with minimal tree canopy
- Bus stops that are not compliant with accessibility standards.




Broadway on the Bicycle Network Plan

- Most of Broadway is designated for one direction of protected bicycle lane in the Somerville Bicycle Network Plan.
- One block between Endicott Ave and Russell Rd is designated for protected bicycle lanes in both directions.
 - This is critical for connecting the Neighborways on Endicott Ave and Russell Rd.
- Neighborways are low stress, low vehicle volume and slow speed streets prioritizing people walking, wheeling and biking. People biking can use the full street. If Neighborways are one-way for vehicles, bikes are still able to go in both directions.

Anticipated Project Timeline



Proposed Design and Parking Regulations



- Safer crossings and intersections
 - Shorten crossing distances and improve sightlines with curb extensions
 - Slow vehicles and improve visibility of pedestrians by raising crossings to sidewalk level
 - Add connections to abutting Neighborways that are comfortable for all ages and abilities






- Protected bike lanes (PBLs) in both directions
 - Mix of sidewalk and street level PBLs
 - Pre-cast concrete curb protection for street level PBLs
- In response to a comprehensive evaluation of traffic and crash data, hearing substantial advocacy in community feedback, and evaluating the important bike connections.





- Enhanced bus rider experience and operations
 - New floating bus stops
 - Add new shelters and/or benches at bus stops
 - Optimize stop spacing



- Street beautification and amenities
 - Street trees and plantings
 - Benches
 - Trash and recycling bins




- Preserve one side of on-street parking
 - Proposed reduction of on-street parking spaces on West Broadway from ~62 to ~32
 - Prioritize preserving parking and loading near businesses
 - Increase handicap accessible parking
 - Optimize parking regulations
- Parking study conducted November 2023
 - Parking counts collected at 12pm, 6pm, and 9pm on Broadway and ~200 feet down side streets
 - Between 26-31 parking spaces on West Broadway were available (42-50% of total)
 - Between 35-61 parking spaces on side streets were available (22-38% of total)
 - We anticipate that parking demand will be accommodated with removal of one side of onstreet parking


 Concern about impacts of on-street parking removal for small businesses.


Public Feedback Period
