- Community Events
  - Reviewing ongoing project areas planning regarding 3 organizations

  - Could repurpose one of them for our walkthrough audit, then put together letter for Union Square improvements
- Design Review
  - Snow clearing: maybe organize topics and questions in next meeting talk to local candidates
  - Letter add to March agenda for vote

# City Update: Mobility 2024 Key Performance Indicators & Maffa/Mystic Bridge Replacement Project (40 Minutes)

- Mobility staff will present their <u>2024 Key Performance Indicators (KPI) report</u> on mobility and safety in Somerville over the past year. Katherine White presented.
  - Key Performance Indicators every winter see https://somervillema.gov/VisionZero
  - Highlights Pedestrians, Maffa Way, Elm/Beacon Open House March 10
  - Bus ridership significantly decreased from pre-pandemic levels. Evening pedestrian trips up;
     morning trips are down.
  - Crash data is sourced from MA state portal.
  - o Pedestrian crashes up slightly but trending downward; no deaths last year, again.
  - o 2 miles of sidewalk rebuilt every year how many total?
  - Alessandra Q: Are we expecting bus ridership increase with redesign? Any strategies to increase ridership?
  - Kate: There is reduced delay being seen at one line which makes it seem more reliable (Union->Harvard)
  - Julian (Guest) Q: How have traffic signals changed?
  - Kate: Most pedestrian signals are default (non-request) but these need audible signals, e.g.
     Bow & Summer there are countdown timers rather than walk/don't-walk.
  - Joel (Guest) Q: How much of the dropoff is due the GLX or electric BlueBikes?
  - Kate: Anecdotally, the 109 to Orange Line is faster than Green Line.
  - Julian Q: Cars going faster than 25mph do we have stats on the vehicular throughput as well?
  - Kate: yes ATR automatic traffic recorders have both sets of data.
  - Vitor Q: Can we start collecting pedestrian fall data? Boston Globe article mentions 3X higher falls this year (https://www.bostonglobe.com/2025/02/19/metro/ice-related-injuries-boston-streets)
  - Kate: Somerville-specific fall data would be interesting but Somerville has no hospitals KW will inquire.
- Mobility staff will also give a brief overview of MassDOT's ongoing <u>Maffa Way/Mystic Ave bridge</u> replacement project.
  - All are encouraged to attend the next Somerville-focused public meeting on February 26,
     6:00PM, at the Somerville Central Library (79 Highland Ave).
  - Corresponding safety improvements are wanted.
  - Two public meetings on 2/24 & 2/26
  - Alessandra Q: What final separation will there be between traffic and the bike lane?
  - Kate: There will be a raised median between them.
  - Brenda Q: Mystic Ave bridge shoulder is enormous can that space be allocated differently?
  - Kate: We asked but it is difficult to get MassDOT to move away from long-standing large shoulders designs we hope the final design uses the space better.

#### Review PTAC 2024 Annual Report (10 Minutes)

- Julian Q: What is meant by the North South Somerville Connector?
- Alessandra: We don't have good transit connections North-South, they are mostly East-West; could we have smaller transit vehicles for the North-South hills?

Report approved for publication without objection, pending final tweaks

#### PTAC Enforcement Survey Results (20 Minutes)

- Alessandra: At our January meeting, we voted to administer a survey to gauge PTAC members'
  views on street safety enforcement and guide our future advocacy. At this meeting, we will present
  the survey results and discuss next steps. See slides responses; deciding on next steps.
  - Vitor: We could collect unanimous responses and move forward with those.
  - Alessandra Q: Could state representatives come to a meeting to talk about the process of getting bus lane legislation?
  - Kate: We have advocated for automated vehicle enforcement but those bills are still stuck in legislature
  - Brenda: I'm surprised at the even spread of the responses about enforcement.
  - Alessandra: Is anyone opposed to moving forward with the unanimous results? I see support for that and no opposition - is it worth discussing the non-unanimous ones such as increased SPD involvement?
  - Perhaps discuss in the smaller groups to avoid the intimidation of entire (large) group?
  - o Summary preliminary strategy: more advocacy and guests regarding automated enforcement.
  - Strategizing interrogating differences of opinions regarding enforcement.
