# Review Latest Draft of Snow Clearing Letter

- 1. latest draft of an advocacy letter on snow clearing in Somerville
- 2. Vitor highlighted several requests from the letter:
  - a. separate regulations for ice
  - b. stricter snow regulations
  - c. increase enforcement
  - d. improve public outreach
  - e. treating minor storms differently
  - f. 24 hour goal to full recovery
  - g. construction zones
  - h. businesses
  - i. increase fees and standards for landlords
  - j. bus stops
  - k. improve sidewalk designs
  - l. explore partnerships
  - m. explore city snow removal
- 3. Group discussion generally favorable with a few minor changes

- a. partnerships -> single point of contact in the city to own this
- b. language tweaks around snow removal costs
- c. suggestion for prioritization among requests
- d. discussion around viability of zero tolerance for ice, should we consider pretreating sidewalks to prevent ice buildup
- e. value of ticketing vs clearing & ticketing (to ensure problem is actually fixed)
- f. should stress impact of unsafe sidewalks on people with disabilities
- 4. Alessandra moves to send to city with edits, many seconds, unanimous vote in favor

### Parking & Curb Use Study Progress with the Parking Department

- 1. Jackie from CoS to provide update on parking and curb use study
- 2. <u>full report</u> on city website
- 3. Strategies fall into four major buckets
  - a. admin and operations
  - b. revise the permit program
  - c. reallocate curb space to meet community goals
  - d. regulations to manage parking demand
- 4. [I wish I had captured the policies that Jackie presented but it went very fast and I didn't have the slides to get the titles maybe could be a post-meeting addition?]
- 5. Q&A
  - a. how much progress is being made on the strategies? some progress being made on most of the medium and high priority items
  - b. goal number of safety sticks? not a target, need to make sure the office can keep up with volume of tickets being issued
  - c. false positives on the safety stick? Jackie doesn't have the answer but she'll check back
  - d. comment: signage around safety sticks could be better and might be a better deterrent

# Review Elm-Beacon Connector Concept Design

- 1. Kate briefly presented the designs <u>available on city's website</u>
  - Quick build safety improvements on Elm, Somerville, and Mossland bike lanes, crosswalk visibility, centerline hardening, signal updates, bus stop relocation, narrowing car lanes throughout
  - b. remove the slip lane at Beech and Elm
  - c. Turning Mossland at Elm into a dead end (but allowing bikes, peds, and fire truck through)
  - d. harden turning for vehicles at Beacon and Somerville
  - e. timeline originally planned for 2025 using a federal grant so might be 2026
- 2. Vitor summarized discussion from Design Review meeting
  - a. generally very much in favor of these changes
  - b. curious to know how the new public space at Beacon and Elm will be used
    - Kate: not decided yet, will still be asphalt but trying to indicate it's curb and not street
  - c. possibility to add trees along Somerville over the railroad tracks?
    - i. Cambridge has tried it on their end of Somerville and we're watching to see if it works. planters not really in scope for quick build
  - d. bus stop spacing?
    - i. within MBTA's recommended distance but will discuss again

- e. possibility to make other improvements at Elm and White to coordinate turning movements vs pedestrians there?
  - i. this project is big already but White may get a dedicated project because of the complexity with Cambridge

#### 3. Discussion

- a. Can the crosswalk across White be raised? Or maybe dead end White like Mossland?
  - i. [see above]
- b. Seconding the trouble with the grocery parking lot, big fan of the Beech changes
  - new management group for the Porter Square shopping center and they're interested in dialogue with city
- c. Audible signals, tactical strips?
  - i. yes, always add audible signals when upgrading signals. can't add new curb ramps in quick build but tactical warning pads will be replaced if damaged or missing
- d. Bus stop usage on Somerville Ave?
  - i. heavy usage at Porter, much lower on the others
- 4. Kate: any thoughts on traffic signal changes?
  - a. Would like to discuss concurrent vs exclusive ped phases in a broader context in a future meeting
