Announcements

- Alessandra motioned to accept May and June minutes, seconded by Brenda
- Brenda gives an overview of changes for planning secretary responsibilities
- New member addition, Mackenzie, is proposed by Alessandra, Preston seconded, group approves

Subcommittee Updates (10 Minutes)

- Community Events
 - Ted, we planned and coordinated on the Somerville Ave walk last monday, reviewing unions square walk audit results which is circulating to participants before being finalized, Planning farmers market (Ted)
 - Kate added that that scaffolding is taking some of the parking lot, so we may not have a community table until August, most likely on the 9th
 - Alessandra, enforcement conversation (generally probe automated enforcement, discussed concerns and trade offs, Will Mbah was present)
- Design Review did not meet
- Special Projects did not meet

Discussion on Somerville Avenue Quick-Build Project (25 Minutes)

- Project overview
 - Viola gives a quick introduction to the project, highlighting the pro and cons of the quick build(changeable/temporary, but does not allow for bigger changes or repaying)

- Some parking will be removed, protected bike lanes will be added and improved sightlines for pedestrians. Potentially traffic signal timing changes and bus stop changes,
- No new paving, sidewalk, or raised crosswalks.
- Timeline, initial community outreach is closing
 - Design over winter
 - Outreach for design feedback in the spring
- Reviewing slides and highlighting the existing intersection and crosswalks
- Highlighting that maintenance issues would need to go through DPW
- o Potential for signal changes and bus stop changes, seeking feedback

Discussion

- Ted- on possibility for adding equipment, what would this be
 - Viola- Not whole new lights, more potential for removal, or adding in an additional phase/signal for bikes at part st
- o Ted- anything that we need to address before they are locked in
 - Viola, no, mobility is generally open to anything at this time, cannot think of anything right now, but please reach out if anything comes up.
- Vitor, on questions for center and somerville
 - Kate, construction slated for this year
 - Viola, the construction and changes may affect plans
- Karen, wilson sq stub/slip lane plans?
 - Viola, this may be in the scope of the elm/beacon plan, currently being used in that plan as a right turn lane and essential.
 - Kate, the plans will be tackled in the Elm Beacon project and more will be available when the next plans are made available.
- Brenda, new office sidewalk, how/why was it funded, what would allow for this with other project
 - Justin, part of the design approval and impact mitigation required renewal of the streetscape
- Alessandra, discussing some notes from the community walk:
 - Lowell st
 - Dangerous car turning left off os somerville ave, timing overall was good, cyclists prefer the area, Mackenzie suggested better wayfinding, Preston highlighted the long cycling timing for the small road
 - Spring St
 - New development at spring street, comparing to the forge lot on the other side it is much better to have parking behind or below a building for better sense of place and visibility,
 - Cars confused about one way nature of spring street
 - Alessandra, the dark material of building itself radiates a lot of heat next the sidewalk, the city may want to consider rules on material at grade level
 - Beech street, discussions on whether the signals are fully needed,
 - Suggestions included RFB, signal cycle that triggers for cars leaving ice ring lot where they end up blocking the sidewalk and bike lane trying to leave
 - Ted seconded the need for something to manage the sudden rush of people leaving, it probably should be looked at more specifically during one of those times
 - Central street

- The construction project will improve the intersection, Cambria hotel drop off/pick up messes
- Recommendations, Holly raised concerns about tactile markings for limits of raised crosswalks.
- Concerns about what could be done about lefts off of park
- Laura, worried about the right hook on to central,
- Properzi way
 - Generally positive feedback
 - However Laurel st has some poor visibility for peds going west
- Near Market Basket
 - Many concerns here due to the large number of driveways and curb cuts,
 - Limited pedestrian ways from Somerville ave into the parking lot to get to market basket, adding a ped section to the entrances?
 - Need for more bike parking,
 - Narrow entrance on church street
 - Bus stops generally good,
 - The area at church street is chaotic, could turns be restricted to going right, a major area of concern

City Update: Bus Route 90 and Other Transit/Construction Updates (20 Minutes)

- Justin: Some construction updates
 - o 90 coming back to it's pre GLX routing on cross street in August
 - o City is making some changes to make it easier for the MBTA to operate
 - More flex posts in no parking to make travel lanes wider
 - Reviewing broadway turn to make sure it is made workable
 - A few parking spots may be removed,
 - Added enforcement
 - Long term plans for the 90, and 88, need to be review
 - Alessandra, we are planning on having discussions this fall in PTAC on the 90 long term planning
 - Karen, in the last budget cycle there were funds for a new shelter/stop at assembly in anticipation of the 85 going to assembly
 - Justin related, there is a new quick build to make the space usable for the bus
 - Currently testing some zicla products in the area
- Justin, participatory budget funded shelters are in progress with one at washington/webster now installed, new shelters include lighting(solar powered), benches, and shade
 - Ted, question on whether old shelters are movable,
 - Justin, unfortunately not feasible, contractors advise they will fall apart if attempted to move
 - Vitor, confirming what the power is used for
 - Justin, just the lighting
 - Justin, MBTA is going through a few shelters they funded, a mix of new and replacements
 - o Ted, was the one at Somerville new tech building funded by the developer,
 - Justin, yes the MBTA works with others for this type of upgrade
 - Once installed the shelters move to MBTA for maintenance
- Kate on reconstructed sidewalks, in areas such as holland st and college ave to wrap up the projects

- Highlighting new bump out for tree on walnut st making it passable and saving the tree
- Reading out a list of recently installed/upgraded curb ramps as well as two new raised intersections.
- Vitor thoughts on raised intersections with asphalt vs bricks
 - Asking for feedback on if it sufficiently conveys the use
 - Kate talking about the ease or maintenance/cost vs tactile effectiveness
 - Excited to try the new textured pavement markings
 - Eversource loves to come in and build trenches, and this will help us to better address
- New plans published for middlesex ave behind trader joes area, planned for fall construction, welcoming feedback
 - Full design available online
 - Some signal changes planned for Middlesex ave at Foley, which includes the removal of the ped exclusive phase,
 - Justin added that it is moving to protected concurrence which also provides better protection for bikes
 - Adds bike lanes and better marking for the area
- On participatory budget Alessandra asks how that planning and process impacts the mobility team
 - Viola and Justin talk about how it was a learning process with new timeline and scheduling concerns that are not typical, in a better place for the second version.
