This decision summarizes the findings made by the Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) or their designee regarding the historic significance of the principal structure at 10 Sargent Ave.

LEGAL NOTICE

Determination of Historic Significance 10 Sargent Avenue - HP25-000056 Applicant: Law Office of Michael LaRosa Owner: Patrick and Kayla Canty

The Applicant seeks to demolish a building constructed a minimum of 75 years ago.

DETERMINATION

At their meeting on September 16, 2025, the HPC voted 5-0 to find the principal building located at 10 Sargent Ave, Historically Significant in accordance with Section 7-28 (e) (3) (b) of the Demolition Review Ordinance (DRO) 2020-22, as amended 12-08-2022. The HPC found that the building is

b. Historically or architecturally significant (in terms of period, style, method of building construction, or association with a reputed architect or builder) either by itself or in the context of a group of buildings, and therefore it is in the public interest to be preserved or rehabilitated rather than to be demolished.

The HPC also voted 5-0 to adopt the findings discussed during their deliberations. The Commission found that the Italianate architectural style of 10 Sargent Ave is replicated throughout this thoroughfare and thus contributes to a cohesive Italianate streetscape. The Commission also noted that this building has been largely unmodified and has retained its original form and massing.

Therefore, the principal structure located at 10 Sargent Ave will proceed for a future public hearing regarding whether or not it should be "Preferably Preserved".
