# **Urban Forestry Committee Meeting**

Thursday, July 17, 2025 MINUTES

Pursuant to Chapter 2 of the Acts of 2025, this meeting was held remotely

**Call to Order:** Grossman called the meeting to order at 4:35 pm.

# 1. Introductions / Housekeeping

- a. UFC members and Associate members introduced themselves.
  - i. Suput could not attend today, but is stepping down as of this meeting. She sent a message expressing her gratitude to the committee. She plans to remain involved with outreach and tagging trees, among other things.
- b. Co-Chair nominations
  - i. Hendrix nominated to replace Antonino as co-chair starting in September

**Roll call vote to approve Hendrix as co-chair** (motion – Grossman, second – Boukili)

#### 2. Resident Concerns

- a. Residents invited to introduce themselves.
- b. Antonino described experiment burying pussywillow trunks in yard to try to grow a hedge.

### 3. Updates from City

#### a. City Tree Removals

- i. Jackson shared a list of upcoming removals of dead or hazardous trees:
  - Kenwood/ Billingham Large decaying Silver Maple
  - Behind 12 Alpine tree of heaven
    - Tree of heaven removal guidance was shared
  - 49 Moore St Linden
  - Perry Park mostly dead
  - Lincoln Park behind skate park
  - 162 Summer St Red Maple ~8"
  - 70 Perkins St Norway Maple
  - Ed Leathers Park Balsam Poplar horizontal crack

#### b. Private Tree Removal Permit(s) and Exception(s)

- i. Drayton reviewed the permits and exemptions. Have received 26 permit applications so far this year. Recent permits/exemptions:
  - 65 Boston St, undersized Norway Maple
  - 137 / 139 Sycamore St healthy Norway Spruce
  - 60-62 Line St
    - This property involves the removal of many trees, almost all Norway Maple. Committee discussed the implications of this, and suggestions for how to get more trees in area.

# 4. Ongoing Work Updates

- a. Outreach
  - i. Somerville Arbor Day report many UFC members present. West Branch Library was a good location, with lots of foot traffic. Many good conversations were had. Plant giveway was successful, as was the Arbor Day bingo game.
  - ii. General Outreach update: Grossman, Suput, and Davis organized tabling supplies. Set up a sample table for ease of implementation.
    - Two main tote bags with supplies. A few binders too.
      - o Primary tabling bag. Distilled to most important messaging.
      - Backup bag:

- backup resource binder: info about specific things.
- Kids activities
- Still to do: need to work on a tabling pitch. 1-pager of messaging. Also need to create a resource page document for table
- Next event(s): Union square farmers market. Somerstreets August/Sept (not posted yet)
- Boukili shared update about website updates. Confirmed with mayor's office and clerks office that cannot create own website. But a member can take the lead of suggesting updates to the current website and can work with Boukili and web team to make those updates.
- b. UFC Overview and Startup question answering

The committee answered the following question – "How does the work of the committee change, if at all, by the seasons?"

- i. Seasonal Change
  - 1. Outreach events shift though the seasons to align with somerstreets events
  - 2. Keeping tabs on work that happens in the city (consistent throughout the year)
  - 3. Disseminate information to residents
  - 4. More discussion about tree work during the growing season
  - 5. Tree Planting spring + fall activity
  - 6. Tree adoption after planting
  - 7. Watering summer focused activity + times of drought
  - 8. Project dependent work (project review happens anytime though the year
  - 9. Incorporating new members to the committee (sporadic, but not season-dependent)
- ii. Era-change
  - 1. Work is dependent upon the work and interests of committee members and what they bring to the committee.
  - 2. Public sentiment changes hearing new perspectives in the "Resident Concerns" portion of the meeting.
- c. Species Selection and Planting Protocol (SSAPP)
  - i. Tough, hardy, native plants list has been updated.
  - ii. Need a new project.
- d. Somerville's Most Wanted Weeds
  - i. No updates. Grossman to reach out to Taylor.
- e. Additional Questions/ Updates:
  - i. Hendrix Status of updated tree inventory

- 1. Boukili gave a summary of the city's 3 different tree inventories (2009, 2018, and 2024). The 2024 one is still being processed (there have been many steps), but should be done soon.
- ii. Renstrom re: subcommittees, join existing ones vs creating new ones?
  - 1. Grossman Both are good. Happy to have folks join existing committees. Can also create new want people to follow their interests. Subcommittees are evolving and open. All very flexible.
  - 2. Vandenabeele– tree walk tomorrow at Somerville Community Growing Center. That could be an idea for a subcommittee.
