



Inner Belt-Brickbottom Crossing Open House - Tuesday Nov 18



What's Happening?

The City is looking to more directly link the Inner Belt and Brickbottom neighborhood by providing a safe, accessible crossing for people walking, rolling, or biking from one side of the green line tracks to the other near the East Somerville MBTA station.
