What do we do?

Currently in 4th school year and firmly established as part of the broader support network for families

- Comply with federal mandate for McKinney Vento to ensure educational stability of students experiencing homelessness
- Work closely with SPS staff to identify families at risk for/experiencing homelessness
- Resource and referral for families, including emergency response, basic needs support and transportation
- Onsite at SHS to support the needs of unaccompanied students
- Collaborate with city and community partners to support initiatives that prioritize housing stability for families with children in SPS
- Policy and Advocacy

Children have only 1,800 days from birth to the start of kindergarten.

Each of these days is critical to their school readiness and success.



Helping Children with Transitions throughout the Day


Thursday, June 5th, 7-8:30pm






The Multilingual Services Team offers **interpretation services (verbal communication)** for Parent Teacher Conferences, 504 meetings, and school or district-wide events.
