18-22 year-old students (9 week program)**

- ❖ 5 weeks in Carpentry, 2 weeks in Plumbing and Electrical earning OSHA 30 and Hotworks Industry Credentials



COLLABORATION WITH

- ❖ BRUNT Workwear donated 700 pairs of boots with a value of over \$100,000

DPW COLLABORATION

- ❖ LGW is providing SHS CTE students with critical job skills & experience while also helping fill in any labor gaps within the DPW
- ❖ This LGW Program is a Cooperative Education placement and we are excited to have our second cohort of 4 students working in the community
- ❖ Current Programs - Automotive (NEW), Carpentry, Electrical, Plumbing

COMPLIANCE MENTOR GROUP (CMP)

- ❖ The CMP is a structured three-phased 11 month mentorship program for Boston area career and technical school students. Through group learning, job shadowing and mentoring experiences, students become acclimated to a construction project site and familiar with the project based team members who serve as mentors during planned monthly construction site visits.
- ❖ Somerville CTE has participated in this program for the last 5 years. Currently 9 students from Carpentry & Electrical are participating this school year.

COOPERATIVE EDUCATION REQUIREMENT

Student Eligibility (Cooperative Education Regulations):

- Enrolled in an approved Chapter 74 vocational-technical education program
- Have completed at least 1.5 years in their shop
- Be at least 16 years old

Student Participation (Seniors)

- **52 of 147 seniors** are enrolled in Cooperative Education or Internships
- **35% of the senior class**
- This represents the **largest number of student placements for SHS as of January**

AUTOMOTIVE PROGRAM CONTINUES TO MEET THE NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY


The Automotive program services approximately 20-25 vehicles each week, providing maintenance and repair services to community members. Also, this is the program's second year participating in Second Chance Cars, through which students complete automotive repairs on vehicles that are then donated to community members.





SHS CTE IS DEDICATED TO BUILDING SKILLED PROFESSIONALS, CAREER & COLLEGE READY LEADERS, AND RESPONSIBLE COMMUNITY MEMBERS.

Last year we have grown our SkillsUSA presence with 107 students competing in the district competition with 19 students moving onto the state competition. Currently we have 111 students registered for this year's district competition on Feb. 25. Our SkillsUSA participation in competitions has grown 60% over the last 4 years.

We will be applying for the CTI implementation grant for Automotive and Electrical in January / February. If awarded, this will be a two year commitment.
