

Exploring Contemporary Antisemitism

Interrupting anti-Jewish harm without deepening division

About the Programs

Exploring Contemporary Antisemitism is designed for audiences to help foster Jewish inclusion and belonging in mission-driven spaces. Participants deepen their understanding of Jewish identity and peoplehood, exploring how anti-Jewish harm appears in both everyday language and critical moments. The session examines how binary thinking and polarization can hinder empathy for Jews, while offering strategies to **reduce harm and sustain strong relationships**. Attendees leave with shared language, actionable tools, and clear next steps they can apply immediately. These sessions are open to Jewish and non-Jewish participants to learn together.

Skills Building

This highly interactive space creates space for non-Jewish leaders to build confidence and skills in navigating difficult conversations around anti-Jewish harm. Participants gain practical tools to recognize and respond to the complex identities and lived experiences of the Jewish people

Anti-Jewish Harm Framework becomes participants' primary lens for understanding how anti-Jewish harm shows up in rhetoric surrounding Israel and Palestine.

Clarify & Verify becomes a natural practice for participants to check meaning before reacting, reducing distortion and escalation.
