I. Historical Association

Historical Context: Mt. Pleasant and Mt. Vernon streets were both once part of the Stearnes estate and platted in 1840. Early subdivision activity was concentrated between the Charlestown line and Cross Street. After 1846 many new East Somerville residents, such as those located along Mt. Pleasant and Mt. Vernon streets, were Boston businessmen. During the 1860s and 1870s, new Somerville industries attracted laborers due to the adjacent factories along Washington Street, which incentivized a wave of working class house construction.

Evolution of Site: A house is located on the this lot on the 1852 Draper Map which is based upon an 1846 survey according to Charles Sullivan, Director of the Cambridge Historical Commission. The 1850 Census records Samuel Poor, shoe dealer as being within a few houses of Daniel Worthen, distiller who is known to have owned and resided at 8 Mount Pleasant Street. Samuel Poor, shoe dealer also appears in the 1851 City Directory as living on Mount Pleasant Street. However, there are no Somerville City Directories with addresses until 1869 available on line, when another Samuel Poor, prison official can be found living at 15 Mount Pleasant Street with his wife Francis; two daughters, Emily F and Lydia A; and his son, George B who works as a clerk in a store. See attached spreadsheet for details of the inhabitants of 26, 28 and 30 Mount Pleasant Street.

The 1874 Hopkins Atlas shows several properties to the ownership of 26-30 to be owned by Poor heirs. By 1877, Samuel Poor and family have moved across Pleasant Street to number 30. Between 1850 and 1874, the house at 28 Mount Pleasant Street grew several additions if the



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Atlases are to be believed. Between 1884 and 1895 two smaller buildings (26 and 30 Mount Pleasant Street) are shown on the lot. By 1925, the house at 26 Mount Pleasant Street lot was gone. The house at 30 Mount Pleasant appears before 1874 and is demolished c. 1930 per building permit records.

Architectural Description: The subject structure is a 2½ story, two-family dwelling in the form of a Greek Revival style with a side hall interior plan. Architectural details are obscured by aluminum siding and cannot be interpreted at this stage without the removal of the aluminum siding. The windows have all been replaced and the ground floor front windows may have been shortened. The foundation has been parged with concrete. A 2-story porch was located on the rear south corner and has been removed or enclosed. While many dwellings along the Mt. Vernon streetscape are similar in form, it is not known whether the house at 28 Mount Pleasant Street had the same detailing.

Summary: 28 Mount Pleasant Street is 2½ story, two-family dwelling in the form of a Greek Revival style with a side hall interior plan. Architectural details are obscured by aluminum siding. The building is associated with ownership by the Poor family and held numerous tenants many of whom were associated with the Street Railways and the Boston and Maine Railroad. There were two other buildings located on the lot now numbered 28.

Findings on Historical Association

For a Determination of Significance, the subject building must be found either (a) importantly associated with people, events or history or (b) historically or architecturally significant (Ordinance 2003-05, Section 2.17.B). Findings for (b) are at the end of the next section.

(a) In accordance with the historic information obtained from *Findings on Historical Association*, which utilizes historic maps/atlases, City reports and directories, and building permit research, and through an examination of resources that document the history of the City, such as *Somerville Past and Present*, Staff find 28 Mount Pleasant Street to be <u>importantly associated</u> with one or more historic persons or events, or with the broad architectural, cultural, political, economic or social history of the City or the Commonwealth.

The subject building is found importantly associated with the broad architectural, cultural, economic and social history of the City due to associations with the Poor family, railroad workers and especially the early development of Somerville beyond the neck to Charlestown.

II. Historical and Architectural Significance

The findings for historical and/or architectural significance of a historic property address the period, style, method of building construction and association with a reputed architect or builder of the subject property, either by itself of in the context of a group of buildings of structures (Ordinance 2003-05, Section 2.17.B).

The period of significance for 28 Mount Pleasant Street begins circa 1850 with the ownership of Samuel Poor and continues as working class housing in a neighborhood of similar houses.

Integrity

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The National Park Service identifies historic integrity as the ability of a property to convey significance. A property should possess sufficient integrity to convey, represent or contain the values and qualities for which it is judged significant; therefore, the following is an identification and evaluation of these qualities and alterations as they affect the ability of the subject property to convey significance.

- a. <u>Location:</u> The building has not been moved. Many of the houses on Mount Pleasant Street and Mount Vernon Street shown on the Draper Map are still extant.
- b. <u>Design:</u> The form of the building suggests that it is Greek Revival in style but without further investigation, this cannot be ascertained.
- c. <u>Materials</u>: The building is wood-framed and sheathed in aluminum with a cement parged foundation. Windows are all replacements.
- d. <u>Alterations:</u> Siding, windows and other alterations have left only the basic form. The front door has sidelights. The siding overlays the original material as can be seen in the very shallow reveal at the intersections of the windows and the siding.

Evaluation of Integrity: The building retains its integrity of form and location. It is not known whether the building retains integrity of design which can only be determined by the removal of the siding.

The building is similar in form and fenestration pattern to the contemporary houses on Mount Vernon Street.

Findings for Historical and Architectural Significance

For a Determination of Significance, the subject building must be found either (a) importantly associated with people, events or history or (b) historically or architecturally significant (Ordinance 2003-05, Section 2.17.B). Findings for (a) can be found at the end of the previous section.

(b) In accordance with the *Finding on Historical and Architectural Significance*, which addresses period, style, method of building construction, and association with a reputed architect or builder, either by itself or in the context of a group of buildings or structures, as well as integrity, which assess the ability of the property to convey significance, Staff find 28 Mount Pleasant Street historically or architecturally significant.

The subject building is found historically and architecturally significant due to its relationship to the streetscape and its place within a group of similarly important buildings and an intact representative of 19th century working- class housing stock. The subject building is found historically and architecturally significant due to its period, style, method of building construction, and in the context of a group of buildings or structures, as well as integrity, which assess the ability of the property to convey significance, Staff find 28 Mount Pleasant Street historically or architecturally significant. It is integral to the pre-1874 neighborhood and despite alterations is identifiable as Greek Revival home through its massing, and fenestration. The method used for the installation of the current aluminum siding suggests intact architectural details beneath

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III. Recommendation

Recommendations are based upon an analysis by Historic Preservation Staff of the permit application and the required findings for the Demolition Review Ordinance, which requires archival and historical research, and an assessment of historical and architectural significance, conducted prior to the public meeting for a Determination of Significance. This report may be revised or updated with a new recommendation and/or findings based upon additional information provided to Staff or through further research.

For a Determination of Significance, the structure must be either (A) listed on the National Register or (B) at least 50 years old.

(A) The structure is NOT listed on or within an area listed on the National Register of Historic Places, nor is the structure the subject of a pending application for listing on the National Register.

OR

(B) The structure, circa 1850, is at least 50 years old.

AND

For a Determination of Significance under (B), the subject building must be found either (a) importantly associated with people, events or history or (b) historically or architecturally significant.

(a) In accordance with the *Findings on Historical Association*, which utilizes historic maps/atlases, City reports and directories, and building permit research, and through an examination of resources that document the history of the City, **Staff recommend that the Historic Preservation Commission find 28 Mount Pleasant Street** to be importantly associated with one or more historic persons or events, or with the broad architectural, cultural, political, economic or social history of the City or the Commonwealth.

The subject building is found importantly associated with the broad architectural, cultural, economic and social history of the City due to associations with the Poor family, railroad workers and especially the early development of Somerville beyond the neck to Charlestown.

OR




1852 Draper with current boundaries

1874 Hopkins Plate 14-15




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
