November 19, 2020 Open Conference / Virtual Meeting

### **Meeting Called to Order:**

On a motion made by Dr. Green, the meeting was called to order at 6:03pm. It was seconded by Ms. Marchado.

Approval of October 15, and November 2, 2020 Minutes: On a motion made by Dr. Green, the October 15 and November 2 minutes were approved. It was seconded by Ms. Marchado. A vote was taken to approve the minutes.

### **Covid19 Updates:**

The Director, Mr. Kress, went over the City of Somerville's website where residents can find information and resources on Covid19 and it is available in different languages. There is information on "what is covid", its symptoms where to get tested, guidelines on isolation and quarantine and what the difference between the two; contact tracing and how it works. Somerville continues its mobile testing throughout the city. Surrounding towns like Everett and Chelsea are also offering testing. As of 11/19; 1845 total confirmed positive cases and 47 confirmed fatalities. Mr. Kress also provided charts/slides on the city's increases in cases. The slides showed average daily incidents etc.; where the cases are by zip code within the city. The city has added heat maps to locate where covid cases are located. The 2<sup>nd</sup> surge of the pandemic has begun. Kristen Sterllis from Somerstat and her staff are doing the slides and what a great job they are doing. To locate the above information please log onto your computer and go to the city's website at <a href="www.somervillema.gov">www.somervillema.gov</a> and on the top click on the Covid19 tab, this is where you will find a wealth of information. As of yesterday 11/18/20, DPH updated their quarantined guidelines going from 14 days to at least 10 days with not having any signs or systems and if tested on the 8<sup>th</sup> or later pcr test and receive a negative continue to monitor yourself.

<u>Opening of Schools Update</u> – as of Monday 11/16/20 the city and school district made a decision to delay the opening of all their schools until the air filtrations are all installed and working properly. The school district will have to submit plans to the Board of Health about their Covid19 policies and procedures regarding testing.





# **Directors Updates:**

Vaccines procedures can be found on the city's website by going to www.somervillema.gov. Flu vaccines will also be available at the schools given by the school nurses and a community vaccine will be done at Trum field for walk-ins, bicyclists and drive through for automobiles. The city is hoping everyone can be vaccinated by December 1, 2020.
