### Integrated Education and Training (IET) Program

"service approach that provides **adult education** and **literacy activities** <u>concurrently and contextually</u> with **workforce preparation** activities and **workforce training** for a <u>specific occupation or occupational cluster</u> for the purpose of educational and career advancement."

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### Occupational Clusters

# Technical Training in Entry-Level Office Skills

- Digital literacy skills (particularly Microsoft Office)
- Accounts Payable
- Basic Accounting Skills
- Other in-demand skills

# Technical Training in Licensing and Certification that focus on municipal trade roles

- Commercial Driver's License (CDL) training
- Driver's license, with the intent to obtain employment with this requirement
- Hoisting license
- Other in-demand skills

### Ideal Components

- IET program in one or both occupational clusters
- Wraparound social support services
- Career navigation
- Meaningful opportunities to directly connect to work
- Continued service to support 6+ months of job retention
- Adequate training stipends/scholarships









# Available Funding

- We welcome the inclusion of leveraged funds to support the program.
- The contract will be a minimum of one year and a maximum of three years.
- The contract may be renewed if three conditions are met:
  - approval from the JCRT,
  - acceptance by the grantee,
  - and the availability of funds.
