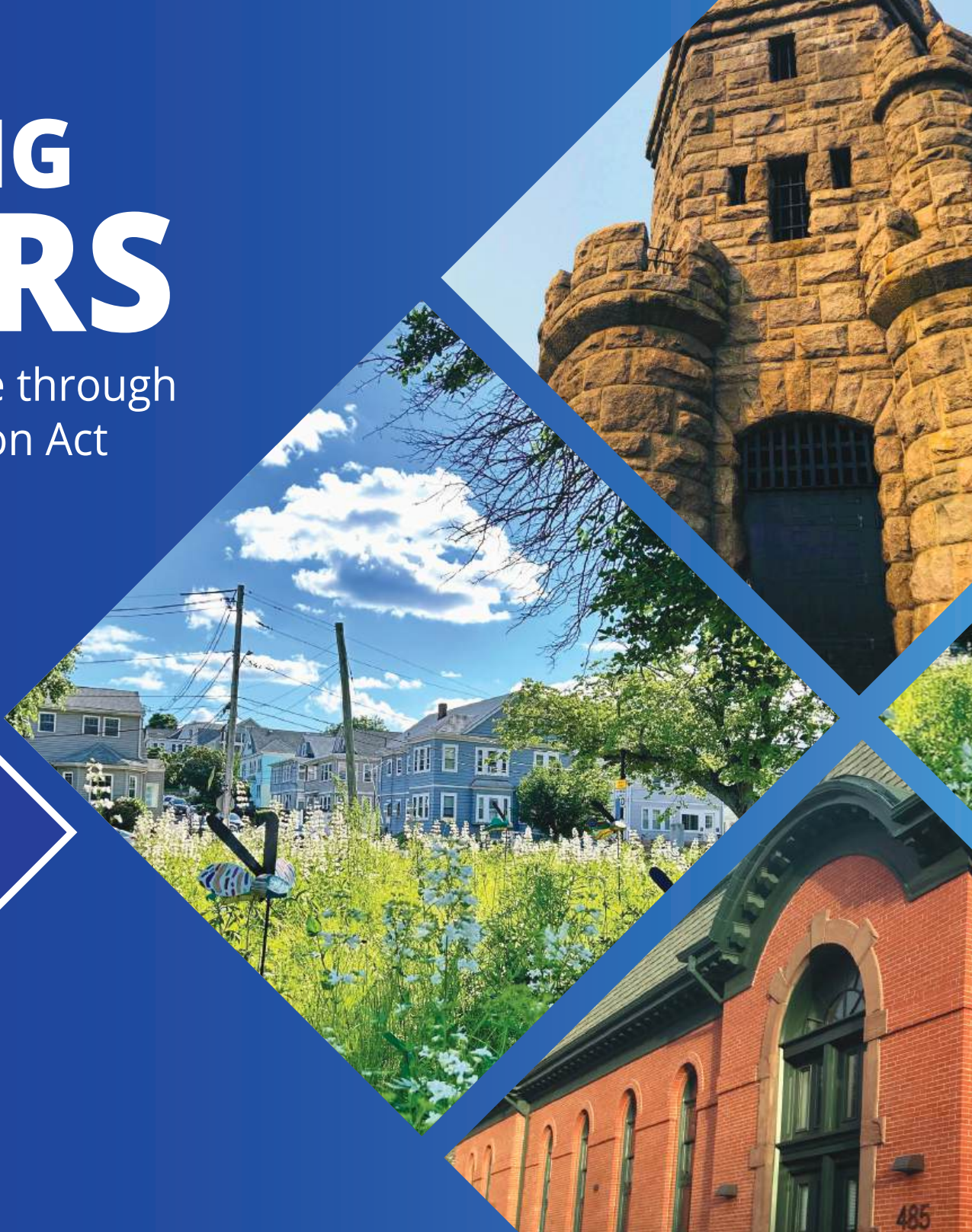
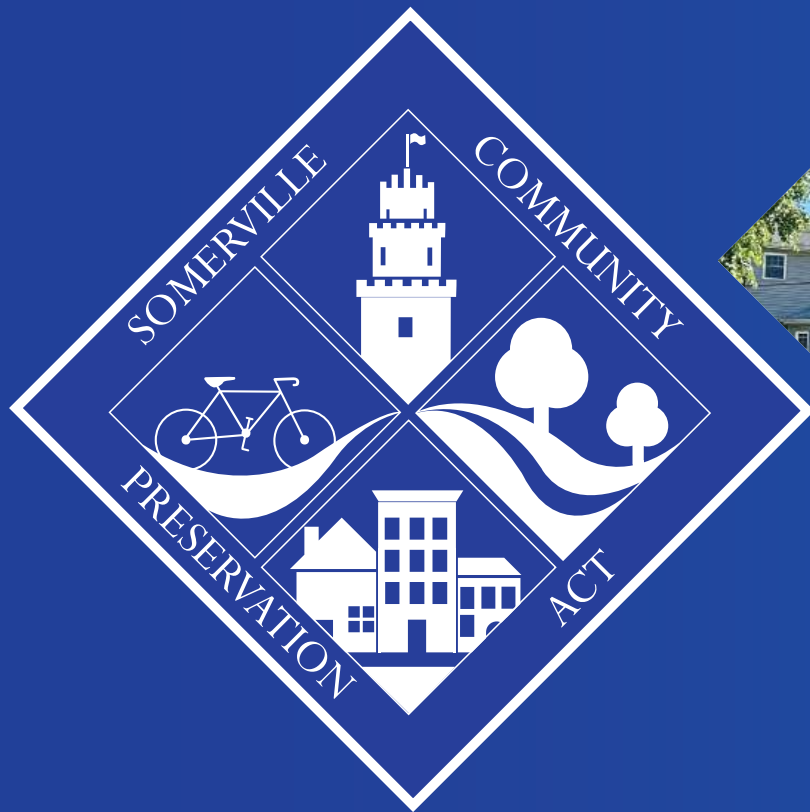

The Somerville Community Preservation Act Program (CPA) is celebrating 10 years since its first funding distribution. Since 2014, Somerville has committed over \$35M to projects that make accessible public spaces, preserve historic assets, expand open space, and create affordable housing.

CPA has contributed to the creation of over 80 affordable housing units so far, and over 150 more in the pipeline.

CPA supports housing assistance programs administered by the Somerville Homeless Coalition (SHC), Somerville Community Corporation (SCC), Community Action Agency of Somerville (CAAS), and other partner organizations.

CPA funds have helped to expand and improve open space, parks, and schoolyards, creating resilient, healthy outdoor spaces.

CPA funds have preserved iconic Somerville landmarks and upgraded historic buildings, making them safe and accessible for community use.

CPA funds have leveraged about \$315M in funding from other sources to invest in Somerville.
