### The Mysteries of the Rosary, Chapter Twenty-seven: The Presentation, continued...

When Simeon saw the infant Jesus in the Temple, he said, **“Lord, now let your servant depart in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your**

**salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel.”** (Luke 2:29-32) The context of this is that it had been revealed to Simeon that **“he would not see death before he had seen the Lord’s Christ.”** (Luke 2:26) Now that he had seen him, he was ready to leave this life.

Are there things we want to experience before we leave this life? Do we have a pre-funeral bucket list? People we would like to meet? Places we would like to go? Things we would like to see or do?

The only thing on Simeon’s bucket list was seeing the Messiah. He shows us what’s most important in life...meeting Jesus Christ.

In case we’re tempted to think that a bucket list with only one thing on it is impoverished, let’s take a look at some of the things Sacred Scripture tells us about the Lord. Saint Paul writes of Christ as he **“in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge.”** (Colossians 2:3) The Psalmist addresses God in these words: **“You show me the path of life; in your presence there is fulness of joy, in your right hand are pleasures for evermore.”** (Psalm 16:11) **“For with you is the fountain of life; in your light do we see light.”** (Psalm 36:9) **“O God, you are my God, I seek you, my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where no water is. So I have looked upon you in the sanctuary, beholding your power and glory. Because your merciful love is better than life, my lips will praise you.”** (Psalm 63:2-3) **“The LORD God is a sun and a shield; he bestows favor and honor. No good thing does the LORD withhold from those who walk uprightly.”** (Psalm 84:11) Jesus said a lot about himself, too: **“Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.”** (Matthew 11:28). **“Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you.”** (John 14:27) **“These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.”** (John 15:11) **“This is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day.”** (John 6:40)

Wisdom, knowledge, the fountain of life, light, the satisfaction of thirst, power and glory, merciful love, a shield, favor,

honor, every good thing, rest, peace, joy and eternal life—all these are offered to us by God in Jesus Christ. As Saint Teresa of Avila sums it up: **“Whoever has God lacks nothing.”**

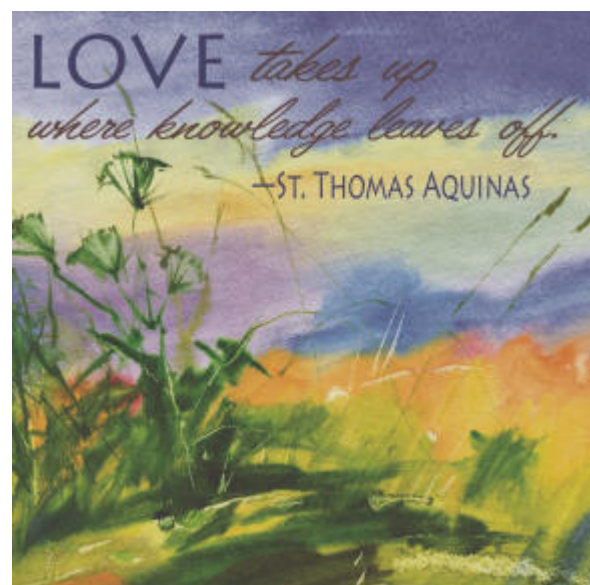
One thing that can blow our mind is to realize that all those wonderful things offered to us in Christ are not like some kind of gift that one person hands to another. On the contrary, they are available to all people who have been baptized and are in a state of grace because they are part of our very being as members of Christ. It’s kind of like how in the human body, the blood is shared by every part of the body. It’s not just in the head.

It’s true that in this life we don’t yet experience all of these gifts in their fullness. There are a number of reasons for this, including our earth-bound limitations, inevitable sorrows and tragedies, sin and the many distractions that surround us. But God is not stingy. His capacity—and desire—to give are greater than our capacity to receive.

In heaven our capacity to receive God—and all that He is—will be expanded, just as someone who is twenty-five years old can usually understand more than a month-old baby. Saint Paul describes this increase in these words: **“Now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall understand fully, even as I have been fully understood.”** (1 Corinthians 13:12)

If we realized the vastness of God and his love, we would want nothing else than Him, and we would see everything and everyone he has created in this beautiful world, and everything he has done, as extensions of his love. Then we could go in peace, now and at the end of this life.

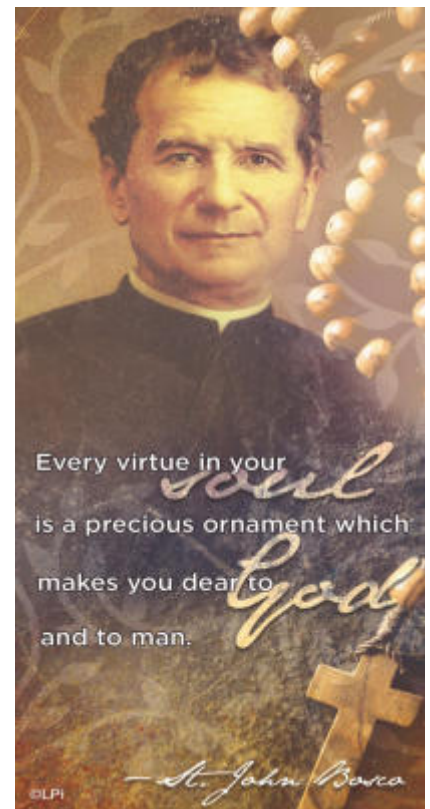

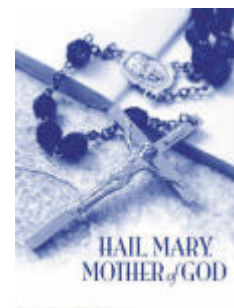
## COME & LEARN ABOUT THE POWER OF THE HOLY ROSARY

**SAINT OF THE DAY - SAINT ANGELA MERICI**

Angela was born around the year 1470 in the Lombardy region of northern Italy. When she was still a young girl, three of her older brothers, a sister and her parents died, leaving her to be brought up by her uncle's family. Also as a child, she had a vision in which she saw the heavens opening and a great company of saints playing musical instruments, and virgins singing, coming down to her. One of the virgins was her dead sister, over whom Angela had agonized as she died without the last rites, who invited her to form a "Company of virgins" that would grow and multiply. Before that vision was fulfilled, she became a Third Order Franciscan. In that capacity—with the help of some friends—she established a kind of a support group for unmarried girls in the city of Brescia. Then she went on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. On the way, in Crete, Angela was mysteriously afflicted with blindness. She insisted on continuing the trip and listened attentively to her companion's description of the Holy Places she was unable to see. Then, on the return trip, her sight was restored in the same spot in Crete in which she had gone blind. She returned to Brescia, where she wanted to help young, uneducated women who through poverty were forced first into menial service or prostitution and then into begging. To do so, on November 25, 1535, Angela founded the Ursuline Congregation, made up of virgins and widows. These women lived and worked in the world and lived with their own families, but they also met often for instruction. The older women looked out for the younger ones and tried to prevent them from being mistreated and exploited. Angela had enemies, especially among rich people who suspected that she might lure their daughters away from arranged marriages. Angela responded by saying that she would remain her "daughters'" caring mother forever, even after her death. Before her death, she wrote about her confidence that Jesus Christ would protect her "Company," for "as long as the world shall last." The Ursulines are indeed still around—the oldest teaching order in the Catholic Church—and are spread throughout the world. Saint Angela Merici, pray for us!
