The Mysteries of the Rosary, Chapter Thirty: The Presentation, continued...

The Rosary is, among other things, an invitation to enter into the mysteries of the life of Our Lord and Our Lady and live

them out, in union with them. There are many ways to live out the Mystery of the Presentation. One way is by becoming an oblation.

What is an oblation? It means a sacrificial offering to God. A person who is an oblation is sometimes called an "oblate."

People can make their children oblates. For example, about three thousand years ago, a woman named Hannah, in gratitude for the birth of her son Samuel, brought him when he was still a young boy to Eli the priest, to serve him as kind of a live-in altar boy. (1 Samuel 1:1-28) When Samuel grew up, he served as a prophet for all of Israel. Later, in the Middle Ages, some parents would bring their small children to be brought up in a convent or monastery. There they received a good education, and when they grew up, some of the boys decided to become monks and some of the girls decided to become nuns.

As Christians, we make our children oblates, in a way, when we have them baptized.

We can also make our children oblates by consecrating them to the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. I have a good friend whose mother consecrated him in this way when he was a college student, fallen away from the faith and living a wild life...as he puts it, "sex, drugs and rock and roll." She did the consecration remotely; she was in Moscow on a pilgrimage and he was in Milwaukee. It worked! Very soon he converted and dived full speed ahead into being a disciple of Jesus Christ. Today he is a zealous and holy priest.

Some adults make themselves oblates of a particular religious community. For example, there are Benedictine oblates, lay people who become associated with a particular monastery. They still live and work outside the monastery, and may be married, but they join with the monks or nuns on a regular basis for worship, prayer, and the service of God and neighbor, seeking to incorporate the spirit of the Rule of Saint Benedict in their own state of life.

Every Christian is called to be an oblate in some way. That's because the central sacrament of Christianity, the Eucharist—meaning both the Liturgy and the bread and wine that become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ—is the ultimate oblation. Every Christian is called to join themselves in this offering of Jesus Christ, in the Holy Spirit, to God the Father.

In addition to the Mass, the Catholic Tradition provides us with some wonderful prayers that can help us make oblations of ourselves to God. One was written by Saint Ignatius of Loyola. It's known as "Suscipe," which is the first word of the prayer in Latin. Here is an English translation:

Take, Lord, and receive all my liberty,
my memory, my understanding,
and my entire will,
All I have and call my own.
You have given all to me.
To you, Lord, I return it.
Everything is yours; do with it what you will.
Give me only your love and your grace,
that is enough for me.

When we present ourselves totally to the Lord, it is like a seed presenting itself to rich soil, a plant presenting itself to the sun, a fish presenting itself to the water, a bird presenting itself to the sky, or a bride and groom presenting themselves to each other. God will do amazing things in us and through us, more wonderful than we can imagine.

The Blessed Virgin Mary made herself an oblation to God when she told the archangel Gabriel, "**Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be done to me according to your word.**" Because of her oblation to God, Jesus Christ came into the world. If we make ourselves oblations to God, He will continue to come into the world through us. Praise God!

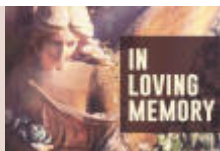

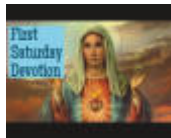

COMING SOON TO A COMMUNION RAIL NEAR YOU...

One of these days you should notice kneeling pads installed along the entire length of our communion rails. They have been ordered but the date of arrival is unknown. What's the purpose of these pads? Well, they speed up the process of receiving Holy Communion. When people come up for Communion, they will spread out side by side along the Communion rail and wait until the priest or extraordinary minister of Holy Communion arrives to give them Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament or a blessing. One of our parishioners from Africa told me this is common practice where she came from. A few parishes in our Archdiocese do this too. I ran the idea by our Pastoral Council and everyone thought it was a good idea. As now, you will still be able to receive Holy Communion kneeling or standing, on the tongue or in the hand. – Father Rudolph

During this time, she was instrumental in growing student enrollment, collaborating with school stakeholders, ensuring student achievement, and supporting the growth and development of teachers. Mrs. Aviña is also an active member of St. Raphael's parish and serves as an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion. She is fluent in both English and Spanish.

I am delighted that Mrs. Aviña is willing to provide important leadership to the St. Raphael School community while we search for a long-term principal. Thank you for your prayers and support during this time of transition. (As for our search for a long-term principal, we have assembled a dedicated and talented search committee. Our first meeting is scheduled for later this week. I intend to keep you informed on our progress.)

SAINT OF THE DAY - SAINT FINTAN OF CLONENAGH

Fintan was born in Leinster, Ireland in the 6th Century and educated by Saint Columba. Fintan is said to have lived on nothing but barley bread and a few herbs and to have drunk muddy water. He settled as a hermit at Clonenaugh, where disciples gathered around him in ever-increasing numbers, so that the settlement grew into a large monastery, of which he became the abbot. He was known for his gentleness and kindness. For example, while he himself led a very austere life, he relaxed his strict rule of life for those monks who complained that they could not live up to his standards. Fintan did the same for neighboring hermits associated with the monastery, who said that the diet he prescribed, combined with manual labor, were more than human beings could bear. He also forgave several monks who left to be pilgrims without asking his permission. Fintan left this life in the year 603. Saint Fintan, pray for us!
