Pawtucket Red Sox RHP Erasmo Ramírez (4-8, 4.75) vs. Buffalo Bisons RHP T.J. Zeuch (4-2, 3.84)

For Pawtucket the Road Ends in Buffalo - The Pawtucket Red Sox and the Buffalo Bisons (AAA-Toronto) continue this 3-game weekend series tonight at 7:05 pm at Sahlen Field in downtown Buffalo. Almost 20 weeks since the PawSox first visited the great city of Buffalo during their first roadtrip of the season (April 8), Pawtucket will conclude the road portion of their 2019 schedule back in Buffalo for this 3-game set. The PawSox are 33-35 on the road this season and have a chance to post their first winning road record since 2014 when they finished with a 41-31 away mark.

Spoil Sports – Like they tried to do earlier this week (but ultimately losing 3 of a 4-game series at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre the past four nights) and what they will attempt to do next week as well (hosting Scranton/WB for 4-games at McCoy Stadium this coming Monday – Thursday nights), the PawSox will continue to try to play the role of spoilers when they battle Buffalo this weekend. The Bisons enter play tonight in 3rd-place in the IL North and -4 GB of front-running Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. The RailRiders currently sit atop the division but with just a 1½ -game lead over Syracuse, a 4-game advantage on Buffalo, and a 5-game lead on Rochester. The PawSox will continue to play a pivotal role in ultimately deciding the North Champ.

Wait til Next Year – Pawtucket – losers of 9 of their last 12 games - has officially been eliminated from any chance of post-season play. The PawSox had qualified for post-season play in four straight years (2011-14) but now have five consecutive non-playoff years (2015-19). It marks Pawtucket's longest playoff drought since a similar five year stretch from 1998-2002 when they failed to make the IL Playoffs.

Happy Numbers - The PawSox are 33-35 on the road this season but they will need to sweep this 3-game series in Buffalo in order to post their first .500 (or better) road record since 2014 when they finished with a 41-31 away mark.

Sad Numbers – On the other hand, Pawtucket will have their work cut out for them when they return home on Monday for a 9-game homestand to end the 2019 season. The PawSox are 22-39 at home thus far and will be trying to avoid a pair of dubious club-records. Pawtucket's Most Home Games Lost in a single-season is 42 in both 2001 & 2002 (so the Sox must go at least 6-3 during the homestand to avoid setting a new franchise-mark in that category). And the PawSox really have a difficult task ahead to not set a team-record for Fewest Home Games Won in a single-season which is 29 in both 1985 & 2002. Thus, the Sox have to go at least 7-2 in order to match that mark and avoid a new team-low for McCoy victories in a season.

The Road Leads Home - Pawtucket is down to their final 11 games of the season (2 on the road and 9 at home). After this 7-game roadtrip ends on Sunday in Buffalo (1-3 thus far), Pawtucket will return home to conclude the season with a 9-game homestand from Monday through Labor Day Monday that begins with 4 more games vs. Scranton/WB (Monday – Thursday nights all at 7:05 pm) and then 5-games vs. Lehigh Valley over the wrap-around Labor Day weekend. That final series vs. the IronPigs starts with a make-up doubleheader on Friday at 5:05 pm followed by a 6:15 pm game on Saturday (with the last post-game fireworks show of the season) and finishes with a pair of 1:05 pm starts on Sunday and Labor Day Monday. The homestand will be highlighted by Pawtucket's "End of Summer Family Bargain" initiative that allows children (aged 16 & under) free admittance for each of the final 9 games at McCoy.

Visitor's Welcome – Since June 7, the PawSox have lost 9 of their last 11 home series but they have won 8 of their last 14 series on the road (with 2 splits). At McCoy they won 2 of 3 vs. Charlotte from July 19-21 and split a 4-game set vs. Louisville, but have lost their 9 other series at McCoy since early-June...0-4 vs. Rochester, 0-3 vs. Durham, 1-2 vs. Indianapolis, 0-1 vs. Buffalo, 0-3 vs. Scranton/WB, 2-3 vs. Buffalo, 1-2 vs. Rochester, 0-3 vs. Norfolk, and 1-2 vs. Toledo. On the road, however, the PawSox have lost just 4 of their last 14 series away from home since the end of May...winning 8 road series, splitting 2, and dropping just 4 road series since May 24.

Close Shaves – 8 of the last 16 PawSox games have been decided by 1-run (Sox 3-5 in those), four others were decided by 2-runs (Sox 1-3 in those), two by 3-runs (Sox 2-0), one by 4-runs (0-1), another by 6-runs, and the 11-1 defeat at Scranton/WB on August 19. So Pawtucket is now 14-25 in 1-run games and 14-18 in 2-run games this season as 71 of their 129 games played this season have been decided by 2 runs or less with the Sox going 28-43 in those. Pawtucket is 27-31 in games decided by 3 runs or more on the year.

McCoy Madness – Pawtucket has dropped 26 of their last 35 games at McCoy Stadium since June 7 and they are 22-39 at home this season which is worst in the league. Pawtucket is 14-10 in their last 24 away games, however, and they are also 24-17 on the road since June 24. The Sox have a 33-35 road record on the season which is 6th best in the league.

Upon Closer Home Inspection – Pawtucket has also consistently played close games at home for the past 2½ months. They have lost 26 of their last 35 home games since June 7, but only 4 of those 26 defeats have been by more than 4 runs. The Sox have suffered nine 1-run defeats, five 2-run losses, two 3-run loss, and six 4-run defeats, along with 15-run, 7-run, 5-run, and 6-run defeats to account for their home losses since June 7.

August Moon – Pawtucket has reached the dog days of August at 7-14 with a 4.62 ERA (94 ER in 183 IP) and a .236 batting average (165-for-700) with 23 HR.

July Flies – The PawSox finished 15-13 in July to register their first winning month of the season after going 10-14 in April, 11-17 in May, and 12-16 in June. This July was their first winning month since last August when they finished 17-13.

Month to Month – In July PawSox pitchers were 15-13 with a 4.35 ERA (119 ER in 246.1 IP) while batters hit .264 (246-for-931) with 36 HR. The Sox scored 138 runs in July (4.9 runs/game). The Sox finished 12-16 in June with a 5.14 ERA while hitters batted .271 with 40 HR. Pawtucket scored 144 runs (5.14 per game) and gave up 149 runs in June. In April (Sox were 10-14), Pawtucket pitchers were well ahead of PawSox hitters as the Sox had a 3.93 ERA (it was 3.47 on April 28 before the final three games of the month) while batters hit .246. The tables turned in May as Sox hurlers hit a bump going 11-17 with a 5.62 ERA in May with 49 HRA and 165 runs given up (5.9 runs per game). Sox batters had a .245 average in 28 games with 25 HR & 138 runs scored (4.9 per game).

Home vs. Road Comparison – Pawtucket has pitched better at home than on the road, but they have hit better on the road than at home. PawSox pitchers are 22-39 at McCoy with a 4.43 ERA (263 ER in 534 IP) compared to 33-35 with a 5.08 ERA on the road (315 ER in 557.2 IP). Sox hitters have struggled at home with a .229 average (433-for-1889) with 68 HR in 61 games compared to a fine .274 average on the road (632-for-2309) with 80 HR in 68 games. Pawtucket has been out-scored at McCoy overall by a 298-234 margin, however, the PawSox have out-scored the opposition in away games by a 366-344 count.

The Last Time We Met – Just after the All-Star break, Buffalo came to Pawtucket for a highly-competitive 5-game series from July 11-14. Game 1 was a 5-4 come-from-behind win for Buffalo as the Bisons rallied for 4 runs in the 8th-inning. The next night the clubs split a make-up doubleheader (Bisons won G1, 4-3 and Sox won G2, 6-2). The following evening Pawtucket evened the series at two victories apiece with a thrilling 7-5, 10-inning triumph on a walk-off HR by Oscar Hernandez. Buffalo took the rubber game of the 5-game set on the afternoon of July 14 with their third 1-run win of the series, 4-3.

Other Battles with the Bisons – Prior to the aforementioned 5-game series in July, the teams had last played each other on June 24 when the Bisons won at McCoy by a 10-6 score. The next night was postponed due to rain and wet field conditions. Prior to that, Pawtucket and Buffalo had faced each other nearly two months prior during the miserable spring weather the teams endured both in Buffalo and in Pawtucket. From April 29 – May 2nd the clubs played an eventful 5-game series in Buffalo. On April 29 the teams were only able to play game one of what was supposed to be a make-up doubleheader (from an April 10th postponement) before having the nightcap postponed due to rain. The Bisons won 10-5 that one game. The next night the squads were able to get their make-up doubleheader in and it was a sad story for the PawSox who suffered a sweep by identical 4-3 scores. A single game on May 1 was postponed due to rain necessitating another twinbill on the afternoon of May 2. Buffalo rolled in the opener that day, 10-1 but the PawSox salvaged the finale of the doubleheader and the finale of the 5-game series with a 6-5 win in extra (8) innings.

Getting to Know You – The PawSox and Bisons met for three series against each other in less than a month to begin this season. From April 8-10 in Buffalo the Sox swept an abbreviated 2-game series and from April 15-17 the Bisons took 2 of 3 during an abbreviated series at McCoy. The Bisons won 4 of 5 in Buffalo from April 29 – May 2.

Stats vs. Buffalo in 2019 – So the Sox are 7-10 vs. the Bisons thus far (4-4 in Buffalo and 3-6 in Pawtucket). Buffalo has out-scored Pawtucket, 86-78 thus far in the 2019 season-series.

Beat the Bisons Last Year – Pawtucket won the season-series over the Bisons in 2018 by an 11-9 count...going 6-5 in Buffalo and 5-4 in Pawtucket.

Northern Exposure – Pawtucket will play exclusively against their IL North rivals for the remainder of the season. The Sox are 32-47 vs. the other five IL North division clubs this season. Pawtucket was 40-49 vs. the IL North last season. Pawtucket finished 12-13 vs. Western Division foes this season and 10-14 vs. the IL South this year.

Last Call – Pawtucket's 4-2 defeat at Scranton/WB on August 21 (thanks to a 2-run RailRiders bottom of the 8th-inning) marked the 23rd time they have lost a game during the opposition's final at-bat this season (compared to 10 wins during their own last at-bat).

Extra Time – Pawtucket has played 11 extra inning games this season (5-6) and only one of those has gone more than one extra inning - on July 5 at Lehigh Valley...losing in 11-innings, 3-2. The extra inning "pace of game" rule (starting extra innings with a runner at 2nd base) has worked to perfection in 10 of the 11 PawSox extra inning games as all but one have ended in just one extra frame.

Five Finger Mordeci – Pawtucket has had four different season-long 5-game losing streaks...from July 1-5, from June 6-9 and also from May 10-15, and April 20-24. Their longest losing streak all of last year was 6 straight – last July 17-22. The PawSox won a season-high 6 straight games from July 21-27.

Double Dipping – The PawSox are 1-6-4 in their 11 doubleheaders this season (sweeping one, getting swept six times, and splitting four others). They have one more make-up doubleheader to play...on August 30 at home vs. Lehigh Valley at 5:05 pm.

Blankety Blank – Pawtucket (only 3-2 in shutout games this season) was finally involved in a shutout game for the first time this season in Game #51 on May 30 when Kyle Hart went 9 innings to blank Lehigh Valley, 4-0. Last year after 51 games, the PawSox had already played in 12 shutout games going 4-8 in those. They finished 9-13 in shutout games in 2018.

League Rankings – PawSox pitchers have the 4th best ERA in the International League at 4.77 (they were a season-high 5.03 on July 4). Sox hitters are 14th (last) in Team Batting at .254 (they matched their season-high .257 from August 3-6). Pawtucket's .982 fielding pct. is 3rd in the league (78 errors in 4480 total chances) as they have made just 6 errors in their last 18 games and committed only 43 errors in their last 93 games.

Series Business – The PawSox are 16-22-3 in their first 41 series played this season (16 victories, 22 losses, and 3 split series thus far). Pawtucket was 16-22-7 in their 45 series last year (16 wins, 22 losses, and 7 splits).

A Look Back Before We Go Ahead - Last year Pawtucket finished 66-73 and in 3rd-place in the IL North (-17½ GB) behind division champ Lehigh Valley and wild card winner Scranton/WB. Their Team ERA of 3.43 was 2nd best in the league while PawSox pitchers established a new franchise-record for Most Strikeouts in a season as Sox hurlers had 1221 strikeouts last year (exactly 1 SO per IP). Pawtucket's Team Batting Average of .249 was 9th in the league. The PawSox had qualified for post-season play in four straight years (2011-14) but will now have five consecutive non-playoff years (2015-19). It marks Pawtucket's longest playoff drought since a five year stretch from 1998-2002 when they failed to make the IL Playoffs.

PAWSOX PLAYER MOVES – None today. The PawSox are at the roster limit with 25 active players. Pawtucket has used 64 different players already this season (35 pitchers & 29 position players). The PawSox used 59 different players all of last year. The franchise record is 70 players employed in both 1995 & 2006.

Thus far, RHP **Marcus Walden** & INF/OF **Tzu-Wei Lin** (both on April 6), C **Sandy Leon** & RHP **Erasmio Ramirez** (both on April 16), Lin again & INF **Michael Chavis** (April 19), LHP **Bobby Poyner** (April 20 & June 10), RHP **Travis Lakins** (April 23, May 23, June 12, and again on August 12), RHP **Josh Smith** (April 26, June 8, June 12, June 19, August 2, and again on August 20), RHP **Ryan Weber** (May 6, July 15 & August 4), C **Oscar Hernandez** (May 17 & June 27), LHP **Josh Taylor** (May 29 & June 14), RHP **Mike Shawaryn** (May 30), 1B/OF **Sam Travis** (June 1, June 27 & July 15), INF **Marco Hernandez** (June 8, August 2, and August 12), RHP **Trevor Kelley** (July 1), RHP **Darwinzon Hernandez** (July 16), RHP **Hector Velazquez** (August 8), INF/OF **Chris Owings** (August 11), and RHP **Ryan Brasier** (August 17) are the first 19 PawSox players to be promoted to Boston this season.

Infielders Eduardo Nunez (DFA by Boston on July 15), Brock Holt (back in Boston), Dustin Pedroia (on Boston’s IL), Brian Johnson (twice and now back in Boston), Tzu-Wei Lin (back with the PawSox), Steven Wright (back in Boston but on IL), Steve Pearce (on Boston’s IL), Heath Hembree (back in Boston), Tyler Thornburg (since released), Mitch Moreland (back with Boston), and Nathan Eovaldi (back with the Red Sox) have been the 11 Boston Red Sox players to rehab with Pawtucket this season.

It was another busy player movement year last season as the PawSox were involved in 196 player transactions during the 2018 season. Pawtucket used 59 different players last season (30 pitchers & 29 position players). The club-record is 70 players used in both 1995 and 2006. The PawSox had 13 different player promoted to Boston during the 2018 season (not including rehabbing players). Pawtucket employed 11 different Red Sox players on a rehab assignment last season.
