Team batting average versus Batavia is second lowest versus division foe

#### TODAY'S GAME:

The Doubledays try to win the series tonight against the Batavia Muckdogs. The Doubledays went 7-5 last season against the Muckdogs.

#### LAST SEASON RECAP:

The Doubledays finished 46-30 in the regular season last year. Auburn won the Pickney Division for the eighth time since 2002. The Doubledays went 24-14 at home and 22-16 on the road. The Doubledays finished the season strong by winning seven of their last ten games and finishing two games ahead of the second place Batavia Muckdogs. The Doubledays led the New York-Penn League with a .271 team batting average. They also led the league in runs (432), hits (722), RBIs (381), and total bases (1,008). Auburn had two of the top hitters in the league. Shawn Pfeiffer finished second in the league with a .329 average and Estarlin Martinez finished fourth with a .319 average.

#### POSTSEASON REVIEW:

The Doubledays played the Tri-City ValleyCats in the first round of the playoffs last year. The ValleyCats had a regular season record of 51-24 and won the Stedler Division by 15 games. The Doubledays lost the first game of the series at home 5-4. They won the second game at Tri-City 5-2. The Doubledays lost the deciding game 16-7 at Tri-City.

#### LONG AND RICH HISTORY:

Auburn, New York and organized baseball date back to 1877. This season marks Auburn's 55th year in the New York-Penn League. This is also the 17th year as the Auburn Doubledays. The Doubledays have won the Pinckney Division eight times, including six straight years from 2002-07, and have won the New York-Penn League Championship twice (1998 & 2007).

#### ABNER DOUBLEDAY:

Auburn's own Abner Doubleday is credited for inventing the game of baseball in 1839 when he was a cadet at the United States Military Academy in West Point, NY. Doubleday is recognized in the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum in Cooperstown, NY. He was a United States Army officer and Union general in the American Civil War. Doubleday fired the first shot of the war in defense of Fort Sumter in Charleston, SC. He also had a pivotal role in the early fighting at the Battle of Gettysburg. The baseball field at West Point is named in Doubleday's honor. The Doubleday's mascot, Abner, wears number 96 in honor of the birth of the team name in 1996.

#### LEO PINCKNEY:

One of the most important and influential figures in New York-Penn League history was Leo Pinckney. Leo was the sports editor for the Auburn Citizen for 37 years. In 1958, he was instrumental in bringing a New York-Penn League franchise to Auburn. He went door-to-door to raise funds and did so well that he got the attention of the New York Yankees. He became the Auburn Yankees first president. He went on to serve 18 years as president of the team and served as the New York-Penn League President from 1984-93. In 1983, the league honored him by naming the division that Auburn plays in as the "Pinckney Division." In 1998 he received Minor League Baseball's prestigious "Kind of Baseball" award.

**1990** Ryne Sandberg becomes the first second baseman to hit 30 home runs in consecutive seasons when he homers to deep left field off Bill Gullickson leading off the fourth inning in the Cubs' 5-2 victory over Houston at the Astrodome. 'Ryno' will finish the season with 40 round-trippers, the most in the National League.  
**2003** Eric Gagne earns his 44th straight save in the Dodgers' 6-3 victory over the Astros at Minute Maid Park. The reliever's effort establishes a new major league record surpassing Tom Gordon, who had saved 43 in a row to begin a season with the Red Sox in 1998.

**Tonight's Start:** 19-year-old Lucas Giolito makes his second start for the Doubledays tonight versus Batavia. This marks Giolito's 11th career start.

**2013 Season:** Appeared in 8 games with the Nationals (GCL) and made 8 starts. Threw 22.2 innings while allowing 8 runs on 19 hits. Giolito finished with 25 strikeouts and 10 walks.

**PERSONAL:** The Nationals top pick in the 2012 June draft. His parents are Hollywood actors Lindsay Frost and Rick Giolito. He was committed to UCLA and the Nationals exceeded his assigned pick value by \$800,000 and signed him for \$2,925,000.

He pitched in one game in 2012 before having Tommy John surgery on August 31st. Baseball America tags him as the Washington Nationals second best prospect in the Nationals farm system.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Attended Harvard-Westlake High School in North Hollywood, CA. Was teammates with Max Fried, who was drafted 7th overall in 2012 by the San Diego Padres.
