LEADING OFF: SURPRISE, SURPRISE, ANOTHER RUBBER MATCH

With the Dust Devils defeat of Everett, Salem-Keizer and Hillsboro battle in a game three rubber match for the right to play Tri-City in the Northwest League Championship Series. Each team took one game in their home park, setting up the winner-take-all rubber match in Hillsboro.

REWIND: NWL PITCHER OF YEAR DOMINATES VOLCANOES

Carlos Hernandez held the Volcanoes to just three hits over 6 1/3 innings of work while recording 12 strikeouts. Steven Duggar, Miguel Gomez and Dillon Dobson were the only Salem-Keizer batters to pick up a hit on a quiet offensive night from the visitors. The Hops, meanwhile, used a four-run third inning to decide things early on.

LIMITED OFFENSE FOR SALEM-KEIZER

- » The two clubs played role reversal, as the league's best offense picked up just three hits while the league's weakest offense pounded out 11.
- » Last night's 8-0 shutout marked just the fourth time in 29 playoff games that the Volcanoes have been held scoreless.
- » In 2015, it was the fifth time the Volcanoes were shut out, second by Hillsboro. The Hops set a NWL record in the regular season with 11 shutouts.

THE RUBBER MATCH

- » Salem-Keizer is participating in its first ever playoff series rubber match. The only other series in the best-of-three format was a 2-0 series loss and in the other 7 NWLCS's, the title was always decided in four games or less.
- » In 2015, the Volcanoes went 3-7 in rubber match situations including one loss to the Hops at Ron Tonkin Field on July 28.
- » Salem-Keizer hadn't played in more than ten regular season rubber match games since 2002, when they played in 11 and went 8-3.

CAN'T MAKE CONTACT

- » The Volcanoes struck out 16 times in game two, three more times than the season high in the regular season (13, July 7 vs. Tri-City).
- » Most strikeouts by a Volcanoes playoff team (previously 14 vs. Tri-City, 9/10/09)
- » Most strikeouts by an opposing pitcher in a playoff game.
- » If it were a regular season game, last night's contest would have set the record for most strikeouts by Salem-Keizer in a nine-inning game (record is 15 vs. Boise, 6/18/02).

NOTES FOR HILLSBORO

- » Also playing in first rubber match playoff series after sweeping their only two series previously (Boise, Vancouver in 2014).
- » Hillsboro improved to 3-0 in postseason games at home.
- » The Hops are now 5-1 in team history in playoff games. Salem-Keizer started its playoff history with a 6-0 mark in the postseason.

CHRIS SHAW: NWL PLAYER OF WEEK, HR CHAMPION, SLUGGING CHAMPION

- » The Volcanoes first baseman was named NWL Player of the Week for Aug. 31 - Sep. 7, going 8-for-23 (.348) with three doubles and three homers.
- » Led NWL in home runs (12) and slugging (adjusted mark of .536).
- » Salem-Keizer and Hillsboro tie for second with four player of the week selections in 2015 behind Everett's seven.
- » Most by a Volcanoes team since 2009 (six selections).

LAVA BURSTS: NOTES IN BRIEF

- » **On the road:** In 13 postseason games on the road, Salem-Keizer is 7-7. In such games, the Volcanoes have outscored opponents 55-47. Salem-Keizer has never lost back-to-back playoff games on the road.
- » **Winning Wednesdays:** Salem-Keizer dropped to 1-9 on the season in games played on Tuesday with last night's loss. The Volcanoes have a favorable 7-3 record in games played on Wednesdays.

REGULAR SEASON NOTES AND NUMBERS

Individually

- **Chris Shaw's 12 home runs** led the Northwest League and were the most hit in the league since Everett's Taylor Ard and Patrick Kivlehan also hit 12 in 2012. Shaw achieved that number in only 178 at bats, hitting one every 14.8 at bats. That home run clip was good for top ten in Minor League Baseball among those with at least ten homers.
- Miguel Gomez set a team record with a **22-game hitting streak**, besting the mark set by Mike Loberg (19) in 2008. The streak, which lasted June 30 through July 27, fell just four games shy of a 53-year old Northwest League record.
- After leading the league in batting average for most of the season, Gomez finished third in batting average (.319) but **led the league in hits (88) and RBIs (52)**. His hits and RBIs mark were the most since Joe Panik collected 92 hits and 54 RBIs in 2011.
- **Ronnie Jebavy** led the Volcanoes with 23 stolen bases, good for fifth in the Northwest League. Jebavy's mark was the most by a Salem-Keizer player since Jesus Galindo stole 47 bags in 2011. Despite flashing the speed, Jebavy also flashed the power with eight homers on the year, the first ever Volcano to rank in the league's top five in both stolen bases and home runs.
- **Jose Vizcaino Jr.** put together a one-week stretch that led all of Minor League Baseball. From July 8-15, Vizcaino went 14-for-24 (.583) with four extra-base hits. The .583 average was tops in professional baseball for that week. The infielder finished eighth in the Northwest League with a .288 average.
- Steven Duggar also finished in the league's top ten in average, placing seventh with a .293 mark. It was the **first time since 2012 that three Volcanoes finished in the top ten in batting average**. Joe Panik (.341), Mike Murray (.326), Kaohi Downing (.312) and Brett Krill (.304) all placed in the league's top ten in 2012.
- **LHP Drew Leenhouts** finished with the Northwest League's second-best ERA at 2.37. With a mark that ranks eighth in Salem-Keizer history, it was the lowest ERA by a Volcano since 2006. He reached the seven-win mark, which tied for the league lead, for just the 17th time in club history.
- Mike Connolly (3.66), Nolan Riggs (3.23) and Leenhouts (2.37) finished in the Northwest League top ten in ERA. It was just the second time in the last 11 seasons that Salem-Keizer has had three pitchers qualify for the top ten in ERA (also 2014).
- Ryan Halstead (8) and Caleb Smith (7) both finished in the top five in saves, the only duo from the same team to both finish in the top five. It was the first time Salem-Keizer placed two closers in the top five in the same season.

Team

- Salem-Keizer's **team batting average** of .261 was good for first place in the Northwest League. It was the first time since 2011 (.277) that the Volcanoes led the league in batting average. The league-pacing mark was nowhere near the Salem-Keizer record of .291 set in 2005.
- Clubbing a **franchise record 60 home runs**, Salem-Keizer also led the league in long balls. The mark was the most the Northwest League had seen since Boise hit 64 homers in 2012.
- The Volcanoes drew just 229 walks on the year. Not only was it the least in the Northwest League, it was the least in franchise history, less than the 238 of 2005.
- For the first time in Salem-Keizer history, the club **scored exactly as many runs as they surrendered**, yielding an unsurprising near-.500 record of 39-37. The Volcanoes scored 350 and allowed 350.
- Budding off of the dead even scoring margin on the year was the number of close games. Salem-Keizer **participated in 30 one-run games, most of any club in the league**. The previous Volcanoes high was 28 games, set in 2002. The 2015 Volcanoes and the 2012 Tri-City Dust Devils (31) are the only two clubs in the past ten NWL seasons to play in 30+ one-run games. The Volcanoes went 17-13 in such contests in 2015.
- Along with Eugene, the Volcanoes were **one of just two teams in the league to finish in the upper half in both batting (average) and pitching (ERA)**. Salem-Keizer's .261 average was first and 3.66 ERA was fourth.
- Salem-Keizer finished last in the league in fielding, committing 117 errors. The league-worst mark came just one season after leading the league in fielding percentage and making just 71 errors a year ago. It came nowhere near the 142-error season set in the Volcanoes inaugural 1997 season.
