

GEORGE AND LIZ SAGE SCHOLAR-ATHLETE **SCHOLARSHIP** for Baseball and Men's Basketball Athletes at the

eorge H. Sage was born in Rifle, Colorado, and grew up in Denver. After high school he enlisted in the United States Army and served three years in that service. He received B.A. and M.A. degrees from the University of Northern Colorado and a doctorate degree from UCLA. As an undergraduate at UNC, George played both baseball and basketball. During his early career, he was the head basketball coach at Pomona College for four years and head basketball coach at the University of Northern Colorado for five years, winning four conference championships and taking the UNC teams to three NCAA Regional Basketball Tournaments.

Liz (Aguerre) Sage was born in Rocky Ford, Colorado. She grew up on a sheep and cattle ranch about 25 miles south of Rocky Ford. Both of her parents emigrated from the Basque Country in southern France. Liz's father began as a sheep herder in southern Colorado and her mother began as a governess for a wealthy family in Los Angeles. Liz attended high school at Saint Scholastica Academy in Canon City, Colorado. She received a B.A. degree from UNC, majoring in Foreign Languages. She began her teaching career in Rocky Ford. After marrying George, she continued teaching in Greeley, Colorado. Liz and George then lived seven years in California before returning to Greeley. Liz then re-started her teaching career at Heath Junior High school, retiring after 20 years at Heath.

After leaving coaching at UNC, George turned to a career of teaching, writing, and research in sociology and psychology of sport and physical activity. He published more than 60 articles in the professional literature, authored or co-authored 21 books (including multiple editions). He is past president of the National Association for Kinesiology and Physical Education in Higher Education and past president of the North American Society for the Sociology of Sport; he holds Fellowship status in the American Academy of Kinesiology. He was inducted into the National Association for Sport & Physical Education Hall of Fame in 2006. At the University of Northern Colorado George was selected for a UNC Distinguished Scholar Award, Lucile Harrison Outstanding Teaching Award, and he was inducted into the UNC Athletic Hall of Fame, first as an individual and second as a member of the 1955 baseball team.

At the annual UNC awards function for athletes, the UNC Athletic Department presents The George Sage Scholar-Athlete award to the top senior male athlete.

Since retiring as a teacher, Liz has been active in numerous community, educational, and charitable organizations. One of the organizations she belongs to obtains the names of families who are desperately poor, and would likely not have a Thanksgiving Day dinner. Liz, with other members of her group, buys food – turkey, ham, potatoes, vegetables, desserts, drinks, and so forth and presents them to the designated families just before Thanksgiving Day. For many years Liz volunteered time, money, and transportation to Eldergarden. In recent years she has been a volunteer for Senior Resource Services. She has done a variety of tasks, such as providing transportation for seniors who cannot drive, organizing a writing contest for 3rd grade students in Greeley to write an essay titled "Why I Love My Grandparents." A social is held at a Greeley public park where the winners are announced and given a bicycle as a reward. Liz is an avid bridge player and plays both social and duplicate bridge. She has also given bridge lessons, most frequently to senior women who are looking for something mentally challenging and which provides them a social outlet.
