

John "Jack" Lee King was born September 10, 1923 in Greeley, Colorado to Edward Earl and Marguerite (Challgren) King. He married Geraldine Goodwin on June 27, 1948 in Sidney, Nebraska. She passed away on February 27, 1958. He married Tulu Kirkpatrick Ferrier of Denver on July 5, 1959.

Mr. King attended Greeley public schools, graduating from Greeley High School in 1941. He attended Pomona College in Claremont, California from 1941-1943. He was a member of Nu Alpha Phi local social fraternity.

He served in the Army from May 1943 until April 1946, the last 16 months with the 42nd Infantry Division in France, Germany and Austria.

He attended the University of Colorado from 1946-1948 and graduated from the School of Business. He was a member of Delta Tau Delta social fraternity and Delta Sigma Pi Honorary Business Fraternity.

In July 1940, he entered his family's business, the King Lumber Company, where he remained all of his working life and eventually became president of the corporation.

Mr. King was a long time member and past president of Greeley Rotary Club. He served on the Board of Directors of the Greeley Chamber of Commerce, Greeley Country Club, and Greeley National Bank from 1969 through 1985. He was Drive Chairman of the present United Way of Weld County.

He was a member of the American Legion, Beebe Draw Gun Club, Lumber Management Conference, Mountain States Lumber Dealers Association, and First Congregational Church in Greeley.
