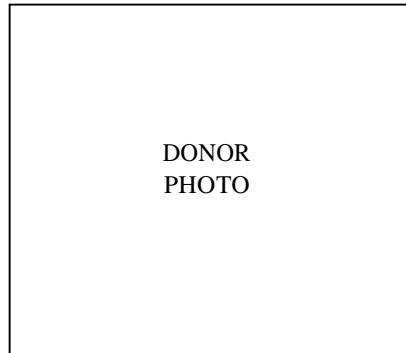

Teresa McDevitt received a Ph.D. and M.A. in Child Development from Stanford University's Psychological Studies in Education program, an Ed.S. in Education from Stanford University, and a B.A. in Psychology from University of California, Santa Cruz. Since 1985 she has served the University of Northern Colorado in a variety of capacities-teaching courses in child and adolescent psychology, human development, educational psychology, program evaluation, and research methods; in advisement of graduate students; in administration and university governance; and in research and grant writing. She has been published in journals such as *Child Development*, *Learning and Individual Differences*, *Child Study Journal*, *Merrill-Palmer Quarterly*, *Youth and Society* and *Science Education*, and co-authored a widely used textbook, *Child Development and Education*. Teresa gained extensive practical experience with children, including raising two children with her husband, and working in several positions as a teacher and volunteer in school and community settings.

Eugene Sheehan received his undergraduate degree in Psychology from the University of Dublin, Trinity College, Ireland, and a Master's degree in Occupational Psychology from the Queen's University, Belfast, Northern Ireland. His Ph.D. in Social Psychology is from the University of California, Santa Cruz. He has worked as a personnel psychologist, vocational evaluator and consultant to several organizations. Eugene came to UNC as a faculty member in the psychology program in 1987 and became chair of the department in 1994. Since 2000 he has served as the Dean of the College of Education and Behavioral Sciences. He was named the University Distinguished Scholar in 1998 and recipient of the Provost's Award for Excellence in 2000. In 2011 he received an Honorary Doctorate from Burapha University in Thailand for his work in establishing international connections between UNC and Thailand. Eugene has published papers in a broad variety of journals, and has led the College of Education and Behavioral Sciences in earning several prestigious awards for teacher preparation.

Teresa McDevitt and Eugene Sheehan created this scholarship to honor the dedication of UNC students in identifying the developmental and educational needs of children from all ethnic and cultural backgrounds.
