Faye Marie Maddox was born May 31, 1938 in Meridian, Mississippi. Her family can be traced back to the Mayflower. She graduated from Meridian High School in 1956 and went on to attend the University of Tennessee. She was heavily involved in the civil rights movement during the 1950's. In 1965 she married Richard O'Dell and moved to Colorado. Faye worked for Rocky Flats nuclear weapons plant for 17 years and retired in August of 1997. She was the first woman to be awarded a mechanical inspector certificate in the U.S. Her family has established this scholarship because of her love of culture and archaeology.
