

About SAGE Scholars

SAGE was developed by educational visionaries, including the former Director of Admissions and Financial Aid at the Wharton Graduate School of the University of Pennsylvania.

SAGE Tuition Reward Points represent guaranteed minimum scholarships – discounts on undergraduate tuition starting with the freshman year – provided by member private colleges and universities. Public (state) colleges and universities give very limited amounts of financial aid that is not based on "need" and are thus not eligible to participate in Tuition Rewards.



Earning Tuition Reward Points

500-Point Enrollment Bonus

Think of Tuition Rewards as Higher Education Frequent Flyer Miles. As a client of a participating financial professional, you will automatically receive 500 Tuition Reward Points for enrolling in the program at www.tuitionrewards.com. Each point is worth \$1.00 in scholarship discounts from a member college. And, each student whom you enroll will also receive 500 Tuition Reward Points (a \$500 value).

Earn Points Annually

Each student earns points on their birthday:

- Birthday points birth through age 11: 500 points per year
- Birthday points middle school age (12 through age 14): 750 points per year
- Birthday points grades 9 through 11 (age 15 through 17): 1,000 points per year

Up to a total of \$11,750 birthday points.

Earn More Points

Families can earn additional Tuition Reward Points by:

- 500 points for a free one-on-one meeting
- up to 3,000 points for referring friends (500 points per referral, maximum six friends)
- 1,000 points for purchasing a professional custom college funding plan
- 2,000 points for an online college training exercise

Account Holders and Students

Account holders can "sponsor" many students (for example, one grandparent can designate multiple children to receive Tuition Rewards). Points need to be transferred from clients to students before the start of 12th grade. Students can receive points from multiple sponsors (parents, grandparents, uncles, etc.) If the high school senior does not choose a

participating college, points may be transferred to other participating students in the family. The maximum points that one student may use at a member college is either one year of college (spread evenly over a projected four years of attendance) or as agreed with the college.

Questions and Answers

Can grandparents help?

Yes. Grandparents, aunts, uncles, or other family members can be account holders.

Is my child guaranteed admission at participating colleges?

No. Each college's normal standards apply.

Can we still apply for financial aid?

Yes. Participating colleges may use Tuition Rewards as part of, or separate from, their normal financial aid packages. Tuition Rewards represent the *minimum scholarship* that a member school will offer.

What if my favorite college is not on your list?

More colleges are being added all the time. Your favorite may be on the list by the time you select a school. Start earning your Tuition Rewards now!

Is any money deducted from my assets?

NO! These scholarships are not cash; they are tuition discounts similar to frequent flyer miles – an extra benefit for being a valued customer!

What else should I know?

The enrollment deadline is *June 30th* of the year the student begins 12th grade; Tuition Reward Points must be allocated to students before *August 31st* of the year that 12th grade begins.

What's the 'catch'?

The 'catch' is that our private colleges and universities are looking to recruit more or better students. This program helps colleges reach their enrollment goals – and you to reach yours!
