FIRST TRUST COMMENT #1:

Global dividends increased by 22.0% year-over-year to \$403.5 billion in Q3'21, as measured by the Janus Henderson Global Dividend Index, according to its own release. That is an all-time high for a third quarter. The U.S. accounted for \$130.7 billion of that total, also a record high for a third quarter. Globally, 90% of companies either raised their dividend payout or maintained it. Janus Henderson estimates that global dividend payments will total \$1.46 trillion in 2021. It expects dividends to surpass the pre-pandemic peak by year-end.

FIRST TRUST COMMENT #2

The prices of both live and artificial Christmas trees are up 10% to 30% this year over last year's prices, according to Money. The American Christmas Tree Association reported that the average cost of a live tree will be \$78, while the cost for an artificial tree will average \$104. Americans purchase close to 30 million live trees every year. On top of the current supply chain crisis, inventory is expected to be pinched this year due to farmers planting less trees back in the 2008-2009 financial crisis. Trees can take more than a decade to mature.

INFLATION #1:

Milton Friedman famously said, "Inflation is always and everywhere a monetary phenomenon in the sense that it is and can be produced only by a more rapid increase in the quantity of money than in output."¹ We are currently engaged in a test of this proposition.

M2 is a measure of the U.S. money stock that includes M1 (currency and coins held by the non-bank public, checkable deposits, and travelers' checks) plus savings deposits (including money market deposit accounts), small time deposits under \$100,000, and shares in retail money market mutual funds. Essentially, M2 is our money supply.

Friedman called inflation a "hidden tax," "taxation without representation." He meant that inflation acted as a tax in a way that was both sneaky and a double whammy: The nominal increase in a worker's paycheck pushed him into higher tax brackets even as inflation meant that what he had left bought fewer goods and services.

Milton Friedman said you should follow M2 to predict inflation.

Our money supply is up 32% over the last 21 months which is why we are seeing inflation.

INFLATION #2:

One irony of inflation is that while it's bad for Americans...especially retired Americans, it's great for the government. Tax revenues soar as nominal profits and incomes rise, and for evidence simply look at the boom in state and local government coffers. They've rarely had it so good, but don't expect them to be frugal spenders.

Overall state and local government receipts including federal aid were 23% above pre-pandemic levels in the third quarter through September thanks to Congress's gusher of spending and the strong economic recovery, according to the Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget.

TAX RATES IN USA:

PJ/DB, when you watch the olympics, do you generally root for Americans to win medals? We Americans like to be first. Maybe that's why we elected President Good Joe; if the \$4 trillion House spending bill passes...the Build Back Broker Plan... the U.S. will have the highest combined federal and state personal income tax rate in the developed world.

Today the U.S. is in the middle of the pack with a still very high top rate on income of 42.9%, including federal and average state tax rates. That's a little above the current Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development average of 42.6%.

TRASH FROM RUSSIA:

Did you know that Hillary Clinton's pals in Russia conducted an anti-satellite test on a week ago Monday that created hundreds of thousands of debris pieces in low Earth orbit.

Orbital debris has been a problem since the dawn of the Space Age. The first piece was the rocket body from Sputnik I in 1957. There are at least half a million pieces the size of a marble, and many millions more too small to track. Because objects in orbit travel at 17,500 miles an hour, even tiny fragments can destroy space assets upon impact.

Saule Omarova continues to make the case against her nomination to be Comptroller of the Currency, as critics need only to quote her own words.

Why, untold thousands of persons had a hand in every cup of coffee the loggers drink!

THE GLOBAL WARMING HOAX:

The U.N. estimates that even if no country does anything to slow global warming, the annual damage by 2100 will be equivalent to a 2.6% cut in global gross domestic product. Given that the U.N. also expects the average person to be 450% as rich in 2100 as today, that figure falls only to 434% if the temperature rises unimpeded. This is a problem, but not the end of the world.
