In order to avoid a filibuster in the Senate, 60 votes are required to end debate and allow legislation to proceed. Given the realities of the political situation in Washington currently, getting 60 votes for anything other than the most non-controversial matter is likely to be a formidable task.

That is where budget reconciliation becomes key. Reconciliation is a special legislative process created as part of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974. One of the attributes of reconciliation is that a reconciliation bill cannot be filibustered – thus allowing the Senate to pass a reconciliation bill with a simple majority vote (including a tie vote plus the vice president). There can only be one reconciliation bill under an annual budget for each of revenue, spending and debt. If a single reconciliation bill has both spending and revenue provisions (which would be the case for legislation with tax provisions), no other reconciliation bill affecting spending or revenue is allowed with respect to that budget.

The \$3.5 tyn Budget Reconciliation Bill meandering it's way thru Congress will actually cost \$5.48 tyn over 10 years, according to The Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget.
