SPECIAL MINISTRIES IS CHRIST'S MINISTRY

Scripture makes it clear that we are to love and serve those with special needs. In Leviticus 19:14 God tells His people to care for those with disabilities, and He gives us examples throughout Scripture of what obeying this command looks like. In the Old Testament, King David showed compassion to Mephibosheth, the disabled son of Saul's son and David's friend, Jonathan, because he wanted to "show [him] the kindness of God" (2 Samuel 9).

In the New Testament, we see how Jesus showed love and compassion to those with

disabilities—Mark 1:41 tells us that He was "moved with compassion" to heal the leper who came to Him. Christ reached out to the blind, deaf, paralyzed, and mentally ill throughout His ministry, showing that God created those with special needs in order to display His power and strength in their weaknesses (Matthew 15:31, John 9:1–3).

For more than 40 years, the mission of Special Ministries at Grace Church has been to evangelize and disciple the disabled (Matthew 28:18–20). We strive to provide opportunities for people with disabilities to

participate fully in church life, whether this means presenting truth in an accessible way, or facilitating corporate worship. In Jesus' words, we must invite them to the banquet, believing that we will be blessed by doing the work of our Savior (Luke 14:13).

If you're looking for a ministry opportunity, please prayerfully consider serving alongside us. You will find incredible blessings, your life will be enriched by serving our church family in this way, and God will be glorified.



THE HEAR OF STREET

This month we commemorate the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation, a movement born out of the conviction that Jesus Christ alone, and not the pope, is the Head of the church. A century earlier, John Huss was burned at the stake for making that very assertion. Protestant leaders like Martin Luther followed in Huss's footsteps, seeking to exalt the lordship of Christ over every area of life and doctrine.

The Reformers contended that, because Christ is the Head of the church, His Word is the final authority for the church. Papal decrees and church traditions must be subjected to the authority of Scripture alone (sola Scriptura), not the other way around. This commitment to biblical authority led the Reformers to boldly denounce the works-based sacramental system of medieval Catholicism, recognizing that the true gospel ran contrary to the so-called gospel of the Roman church.

Fueled by their study of the Bible, the Reformers proclaimed the truth that salvation is not based on good works. Rather, it is the free gift of God, given to undeserving sinners by grace alone (sola gratia) through faith alone (sola fide), on the basis of the finished work of Christ alone (solus Christus). Recognizing that believers can take no credit for their salvation, the Reformers responded to the wonder of redemption by giving God all of the glory. Soli Deo gloria summarizes the triumphant cry of sinners who recognize they are saved solely by grace.

Join us on Sunday evenings throughout October as we set our hearts and minds on the truths of Scripture contained in the five solas of the Reformation, and remember the faithful testimony of the Reformers in their fight for biblical authority.
