Membership Matters

Is Church Membership Biblical?

There's a tension in the local church today over the answer to that very question. Does the Bible require church membership? Understanding what the local church is can help us begin to see why the Lord's plan for every Christian includes commitment in membership to a local church.

The Greek word for church, *ekklesia*, is not necessarily a religious word. It was used to describe a regular assembling of people, meeting to do something. For example, the legislators in Athens who met regularly to discuss politics were termed an *ekklesia*.

Ekklesia is an assembling of people who have something in common. It's a regular gathering of those people at a certain location for a specific purpose. We can see some important characteristics as we think about this word in


a biblical context. What do believers have in common? For what purpose do they come together? The local church has always been and continues to be a group of people who are in Christ, who regularly assemble for the purpose of worshiping God.

The New Testament church modeled unity in the commitment they had toward one another (Acts 2:42–47; 4:32–35). The local church still depends on a spirit of unity and commitment today (Philippians 2:1–4) The Lord Jesus is building His church, and His desire is for believers to be committed to one another (Matthew 16:18; Romans 12:9–13). When you become a member of a local church, you are committing yourself to a body of believers who believe that we are uniting for specific and divinely ordained reasons. We are here to

worship our God, together. We are here to be taught the Word of God. We join together to sing and pray. We serve one another and use our spiritual gifts to build others up. We come together to obey the Lord in the ordinances He left for the church—baptism and communion. We commit to one another for care, for accountability, and for encouragement.

Saying "no thanks" to membership shortchanges the members of our church from the blessing of your spiritual gifts and the benefit of your fellowship. It passes over the responsibility you have as a believer to the local body of Christ. It also deprives you of the spiritual growth that God intends to provide through the local church. Membership is what committing to a church looks like; it formalizes your commitment, and as we'll see in our next Membership Matters article, this is both biblical and beneficial.

Grace Church's enduring commitment to the faithful preaching of God's Word is expressed in our missionary efforts around the world, as well as in our Faith Promise giving. The European Bible Training Center (EBTC)is now in its eighteenth year and has graduated more than 1,000 students, with their main focus on expository preaching. The EBTC has expanded over the years to provide solid, biblical training in Berlin, Rheinland, Zürich, and Vienna.

Christian Andresen, one of our missionaries in Germany who provides leadership to the EBTC, recently rejoiced in what God is doing through their ministry. "It is a privilege to teach these students—they are hungry to know the Word of God.
