Monday - Acts 12

Who is this Herod? (v. 1)

How is Peter vindicated in his conflict with Herod?

What is the significance of the allusion to Genesis 1:28 in verse 24?

Tuesday - Acts 13

Who commissioned Barnabas and Saul's missionary journey? (v. 2)

What is the setting of Paul's sermon?

What is the result of the Jews rejecting Paul? (vv. 44–52)

Wednesday - Acts 14

What was the purpose of the Apostles' miracles? (v. 3)

How does God witness about Himself apart from His Word? (v. 17)

What did Paul and Barnabas do in churches before they left? (v. 23)

Thursday - Acts 15

What role did circumcision have in the Old Testament?

What requirements from the Old Testament did the council say are binding on believers in the New Testament? (vv. 28–29)

Do you think Paul and Barnabas were right to disagree? (vv. 36–41)

Friday - Acts 16

Why was Timothy circumcised, when the Jerusalem council had just decided that gentiles need not be circumcised? (vv. 1–3)

Why is the significance of Luke using the pronouns “we” and “us” in verse 10?

Why does Paul not want to leave prison secretly? (vv. 37–39)
