What motivated the Ephesians' opposition of Paul? (vv. 21–41)

What obligation did Paul have to the Ephesians? (vv. 26–27)

Where does Paul warn false teachers will come from? (vv. 29–30)

How did Paul "help the weak"? (v. 35)

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## **Friday - Acts 21**

What was the purpose of Agabus' prophecy? (vv. 10–16)

Why is Paul supposed to demonstrate that he keeps the law? (vv. 17–26)

Why was Paul arrested? (vv. 27–36)
