Week 10

- *How should I apply this in my life?*

Monday – Acts 22

What is ironic about verse 11?

Why did God want Paul to leave Jerusalem? (vv. 17–21)

What caused the Jews to become angry with Paul? (vv. 17–29)

Tuesday – Acts 23

How did Paul respond to his unfair treatment? (vv. 1–5)

Why did Paul mention that he was a pharisee? (v. 6)

What was God's purpose in Paul's imprisonment? (vv. 1–12)

Wednesday – Acts 24

To what were the Jews referring when they said that Paul tried to profane the temple? (v. 6)

Did Paul reject the Old Testament? (vv. 10–16)

Why did Paul take pains to have a clear conscience? (v. 16)

Thursday – Acts 25

How would you characterize Paul's attitude towards the governing authorities? (vv. 1–12)

What were the reasons that Paul appealed to Caesar? (v. 11)

Who was Festus and who was Agrippa?

Friday – Acts 26

What does the phrase "it is hard for you to kick against the goads" mean? (v. 14)

What did Jesus commission Paul to do? (vv. 14–18)

How did Agrippa view Paul? (vv. 19–32)
