Chapter Two: The God of the Bible is Sovereign None Other by John MacArthur

"We will never wrap our finite intellects around God. His sovereignty is a truth that should provoke wonder and worship. What's clear is that God is completely sovereign, and He never exercises that sovereignty in ways that conflict with or compete with His righteousness, grace, and justice."
