## **Discussion Questions**

1) Kimberly mentioned the following practical ways you can help others know you care for your new congregation through involvement: Show compassion, show respect, be genuine and honest, display the fruit of the Holy Spirit in your life, be a good listener, communicate at their level of understanding, let your yes be yes and no, no, and be careful not to talk about how busy you are.

Take some time to discuss the value of some of the various aspects of involvement. Share one you would like to grow in NOW and why. Pray for one another at the end of your small group time.
