Characters in 1 Samuel 1:1-28

1. Elkanah

- Had two wives (v. 2) but cared most for Hannah (vv. 5, 8)
- Was a faithful Jew (vv. 3, 7, 21, 23)



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- Childless because God closed her womb (v. 6)
- Loved by her husband but tormented by her rival (vv. 6-7, 10)
- Trusted Yahweh, fulfilled her vow to Him (vv. 10, 24-28)
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3. Peninnah

- Mother of many sons and daughters (v. 4)
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Characters in Hannah's Petition — Samuel 1:1-28

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4. Eli

- High Priest (v. 9)
- Poor judge of character (v. 12)
- Sons were vile and disobedient (2:12, 17)



Hannah's Praise – 1 Samuel 2:1-11

1. Personal Praise (vv. 1-3)

Yahweh is the source of salvation, holy, steadfast, omniscient, sovereign.

2. General Praise (vv. 4-8)

Yahweh's reign over all things.

3. Universal Praise

Deliverance of God's people



Questions for Personal Reflection

1. As Hannah rested in God's sovereignty, think of a specific person or situation in your life that the Lord has allowed in order to draw you closer to Him. What might you need to surrender as you trust God's timing and provision?

3. How does Hannah's example of trust in the Lord's perfect provision encourage *you* to hold fast to the Lord during times of trials or disappointment?
4. As Hannah praised Yahweh for His work in her life, consider what the Lord has done in *your* life, and write down five ways that He has blessed you this year, then thank Him for them in private prayer.
5. How can you develop or deepen simple habits of worshiping the Lord in your daily routines? Be specific!
