The National Institute of Corrections is accepting applications for four two-person teams, (8 slots) to participate in the **Evidence Informed Practices in the Management of Women's Prisons Training Program**. Selected individuals will join the classroom of 16 participants from the host state.

Correctional senior-level leaders, managing women's prisons, face significant challenges regarding gender-informed facility operations, policy and procedure, and the development and implementation of evidence-based programs and services. The 32-hour training agenda is designed with reliable and valid learning objectives with modules including medical, mental health, legal, communication styles and inappropriate sexual behavior to engage participants in the strategies for effective change. The training includes interactive material that helps clarify significant differences while avoiding an over-identification of issues that may be common to male and female populations.
