Before Surgery Instructions

Feral/outdoor cats:

- Place in live trap or carrier the night before surgery.
- Remove all food and water by midnight if safe.*
- Arrive with your cat in a crate by 7:30 am at the surgery site. Cover the crate with a sheet or light blanket to help reduce stress. Feliway sprayed on the blanket is strongly recommended.
- Keep your cat in your car until the check-in process is complete.
- Bring the following forms filled out and signed (printed off website www.purplecatvet.com)
 - New Client Form (one per cat)
- Bring payment in cash.

Indoor cats:

- Remove food at midnight the night before surgery.
- Remove water the morning of surgery.
- Place cat in a small crate and arrive at surgery location at 7:30am.
- Bring the following forms filled out and signed (printed off website www.purplecatvet.com)
 - New Client Form (one per cat)
- Bring payment in cash.

Kittens 4 months or less:

- Do not remove food or water until the morning of surgery.
- Place kitten in carrier and arrive at surgery location by 7:30am.
- It is okay to have more than one kitten in a carrier if all kittens are 4 months old or less.
- Bring the following forms filled out and signed (printed off website www.purplecatvet.com)
 - New Client Form (one per kitten)
- Bring payment in cash.

All cats:

Please note: Purple Cat Mobile Clinic is a high volume/low-cost cat spay/neuter clinic. As such, our primary goal is to surgically sterilize cats and reduce the population of feral cats and cats surrendered to area humane societies. We do not provide well animal exams. Our phone and email consultations are restricted to questions directly related to spaying and neutering your cat.

* Feral cats can be unpredictable. Our number one concern for you is safety. Please be cautious as you work with your feral and semi-feral cats. If you have any doubt in your mind about your safety, please refrain from any contact with the cat. Our staff are trained to handle aggressive cats and will do the handling the morning of surgery. The surgery will not be cancelled just because food was left in the crate overnight.
