

General Anesthesia

Today your pet will be having a procedure that requires general anesthesia.

Although uncommon, using general anesthesia has risks involved. To help reduce these risks, we have monitors that will constantly check your pet's oxygen level, respiratory rate and heart rate while under anesthesia. Your pet will also receive a constant flow of intravenous fluids, which will help to maintain a strong blood pressure.

It may be necessary to give an injection of pain medication depending on the specific procedure. You may also be sent home with pain medication.
