Number of Gamblers Decline

Polling company Gallup conducted interviews with 4,450 Americans 18 and older in the first half of June and found that the number of people who've gambled in the last year dropped nearly 20% over the past 10 years. In 2016, 64% of respondents had gambled compared to 45% in this poll. All but one gambling type declined, with lottery participants dropping from 49% in 2016 to 31% this year, betting on pro sports down from 10% to 7%, and betting on college sports down from 5% to 4%. The one category that increased was igaming, up to 4% from 3% in 2016. Poll participants were queried about fantasy sports and prediction markets, but Gallop couldn't draw comparisons; neither had any data from the 2016 poll. We say, less people might be gambling, but casino revenue is still growing and 2026 will be another record year for gross gaming revenue.

Unregulated Online Gambling

According to a report from the Campaign for Fairer Gambling, unregulated online gambling, both sports books and icasinos, generated just under \$100 billion in 2025; the \$97.4 billion was an increase of 45% over 2024, when it was \$67.1 billion. Unregulated igaming and sports betting accounted for 77% of the total gross gaming revenue last year. The report pegged regulated online-gambling revenue for 2025 at \$28.3 billion, up 23% from 2024's \$23 billion. So the total take was \$125 billion, a 40% increase year over year. Obviously, even the rapid expansion of regulated online gambling in the U.S. hasn't cut into the size of the unregulated

market.

Huge Video Keno Jackpot

The big video keno jackpot at PTs has been hit. As you can see, every number on the top line, 1 through 10, was hit, paying a 10-for-10 jackpot for just under \$306,000 on a \$1 bet. It looks good, but this was far from a positive play for players, as was explained in LVA. This happened over the weekend at the PT's Gold bar at Huntington Cove Pkwy. and Fort Apache. WSOP Main Event Winner

Lucas Jumalon, the 22-year-old poker player from Spokane, took first place in the World Series of Poker championship last night, winning the \$10 million grand prize and earning a champion bracelet. He entered the final table with the most chips by far and was the favorite to win by far. Jumalon took the chip lead with 13 players remaining and remained in the lead throughout. Second place and \$6 million went to Lauri Saaskilahti from Finland after a mere 17 hands heads up. Jumalon told ESPN that when he won the final hand and ran over to his family and friends, "I blacked out. I don't have much recollection of that." Jumalon is the second youngest player ever to win the championship; Joe Cada won it in 2009 when he was 21.

Billion Dollar Powerball Jackpot

Someone in southwestern Illinois is suddenly very very rich, after hitting the Powerball jackpot for \$1.04 billion in last night's drawing. The winning ticket was sold by a Hy-Vee gas station in Quincy, Illinois, roughly 140 miles north of St. Louis. It was the eighth largest jackpot in Powerball history and the eighth for more than a bil. The cash value before taxes is

an estimated \$450 million. Back to \$20 million goes the progressive.

Lucky Lotto

Lucky Seven

A man in North Carolina won \$1 million after buying a scratch-off ticket featuring his lucky number. Tomas Munoz became the first person to claim the top prize in the Triple Red 777 Jackpot game after buying a \$10 scratch-off ticket because of his personal connection to the number seven, said the North Carolina (NC) Education Lottery in a press release. "Seven is my number," Munoz told the organization. "I was born on the 7th in '77." Munoz said he bought the scratch-off ticket at Candor V Mart on South Main Street in Candor and immediately scratched it in the store. Quickly realizing what he had won, his reaction was indescribable. "I felt emotions all over my body," Munoz said. The game requires players to match any of their numbers to any of the "winning numbers" to win the prize shown for that number. It also offers the opportunity to win double or 10 times the prizes shown, according to the NC Education Lottery. Munoz claimed his prize on July 27, just days after the scratch-off game was released on July 3. The game winner had the choice of receiving his prize as an annuity of \$50,000 over 20 years or a lump sum of \$600,000. Munoz opted to receive the lump sum of \$600,000 and, after required tax withholdings, took home \$396,060, according to the press release. He plans to invest the money and continue his work restoring classic cars.

SGarbage Workers to the Rescue

A team of garbage workers helped a woman recover a lottery ticket after she threw it away, not realizing she'd won a prize worth

over \$1 million. After a self-service lottery terminal displayed a message telling the woman, who chose to remain anonymous, that her ticket was "not payable," she threw it away in a store near Bari in Italy's Puglia region, according to Italian news agency ANSA. However, Roberto Nicola Toscano, the director of SANB, a local waste management company, told the outlet that the player soon realized she had made a big mistake thanks to a family member. By the time she went back to the shop where she had thrown away the €1 million (approximately \$1.16 million) winning ticket, the trash had already been collected. "And so, the recovery operation began," Toscano told ANSA. "We reconstructed the journey of the ticket, without much hope of finding it, as it had already been picked up by a garbage truck." Then, once they did find the truck, they ran into another issue. "It couldn't be emptied at our facility due to the risk of waste contamination," the official explained. All in all, Toscano and his team sifted through more than six tons of waste. "Among them was the stub we were looking for, which was miraculously still in one piece," Toscano said, adding that the winner "cried with emotion" when she heard the exciting news. He also joked that he "touched the lucky ticket in the hope that it might bring us some luck too," according to Euro News. With that luck, Toscano and his team decided to buy a scratch card while grabbing a coffee after their victory. To their surprise, they ended up winning €50 (approximately \$58). As for the lottery winner? Once she covered "all of the additional costs" that came with the public agency's search, she was left to enjoy her lucky winnings with a crazy story to tell. "This story is nothing short of miraculous," Toscano said, according to the BBC.

Veterans on the Road Again

The government is calling on veterans to consider careers in commercial trucking with the creation of the Freedom Haulers initiative, a new effort to help veterans move into civilian driving jobs.

The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA), with its military driver program, is making it easy for experienced veteran drivers to get a commercial driver's license (CDL). In many cases you can get a waiver on both the skills and knowledge tests.

A few facts: Every state is part of the veteran skills-test waiver program and all have specific requirements. Seven additional states just joined the Even Exchange program, which allows qualified veterans with certain military driving experience to waive the knowledge test.

Eligibility: If you had a military driver's license for at least two years, with no suspensions or disqualifications, you can qualify if you apply within two years of leaving that position. (It used to be 12 months, but with the Freedom Haulers initiative, that's been extended.)

Benefits: Depending on the employer, jobs may offer travel, flexible hours, good pay, health and life insurance, and more.

What if you didn't have a driving job during your active duty period and your MOS doesn't cover you for an automatic CDL? The GI Bill may cover up to 100% of commercial driver's license tuition at approved schools, depending on your eligibility and the program. In some cases that might include a housing allowance.

Before enrolling, verify that the program is approved for your VA education benefits. Call the VA Education Call Center at 888-442-4551 (888-GIBILL-1) to verify a school's eligibility.

Getting Ready for Winter

Autumn Bingo Challenge

The West Virginia Department of Tourism recently unveiled its official 2026 fall foliage projection map, introducing weekly updates throughout the season to provide travelers with accurate leaf-peeping information. They also announced their Almost Heaven Swing BINGO Challenge for the autumn season. Inspired by the state’s swing photo locations, the “SWINGO” challenge invites travelers to

visit nearly 60 swing spots across West Virginia and check in on mobile devices to earn seasonal prizes. To participate, visit wvtourism.com/swings to register for a digital bingo card delivered directly to your smartphone. Autumn colors were projected to spread throughout the region until early November.

Bill of Rights Bingo

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) brought back its popular exhibits and activities to the Minnesota State Fair this year, offering fairgoers a chance to connect with nature through hands-on experiences. DNR staff gave daily talks about the three dozen species of native fish featured in their outdoor pond. People also learned about wildfire prevention at the Wildlife Prevention Building, and a 65-foot Fire Tower. Interactive exhibits featured information about native bird species in Minnesota and their songs. Photo ops included giant butterfly wings, a hiking boot, nature backdrops and Smokey Bear. New this year, families joined Woodsy Owl for Children’s Outdoor Bill of Rights Bingo. The Children’s Outdoor Bill of Rights is an initiative of Gov. Tim Walz and the Governor’s Children’s Cabinet to connect all Minnesota kids to the outdoors.

Florida Gaming Raid

Sixty illegal slot machines were seized from Uptown Bingo in Cape Coral following a raid by the Florida Gaming Control Commission and the Cape Coral Police Department in late July. Florida law prohibits instant bingo on electronic devices that display games of chance, including slot machines. FGCC said the raid serves as a reminder that not all bingo is legal. “Bingo is fun, and the FGCC supports lawful play,” said FGCC Commissioner Peter Cuderman. “Unfortunately, some criminals prey on Floridians by using a bingo theme on slot machines and falsely claim these games are legal.”

Trio Saves a Bingo Player

When Bruce Bredbenner woke up from the cardiac arrest that nearly killed him, his doctors told him that he owed his life to a decision to play bingo. Instead of eating dinner at home, Bredbenner, 74, and his wife, Bev, 72, stopped in to play bingo at the Good Will Hose Company in Cressona, PA in August. During the second game, Bredbenner’s heart stopped. A nurse, a veteran firefighter, and an 18-year-old high school senior with fresh EMT training stepped in within 30 seconds to perform CPR and use an automated external defibrillator (AED) until Schuylkill EMS arrived. Bredbenner, a resident of Hamburg who has congestive heart failure, was expected to return home with no cognitive issues. “If we would have gone home that night instead of to bingo, he’d be dead now,” Bev said. “That’s for sure.” From his hospital bed, Bredbenner thanked those who helped him. And Bev also shared how grateful the family is, including the couple’s three daughters and four grandchildren.

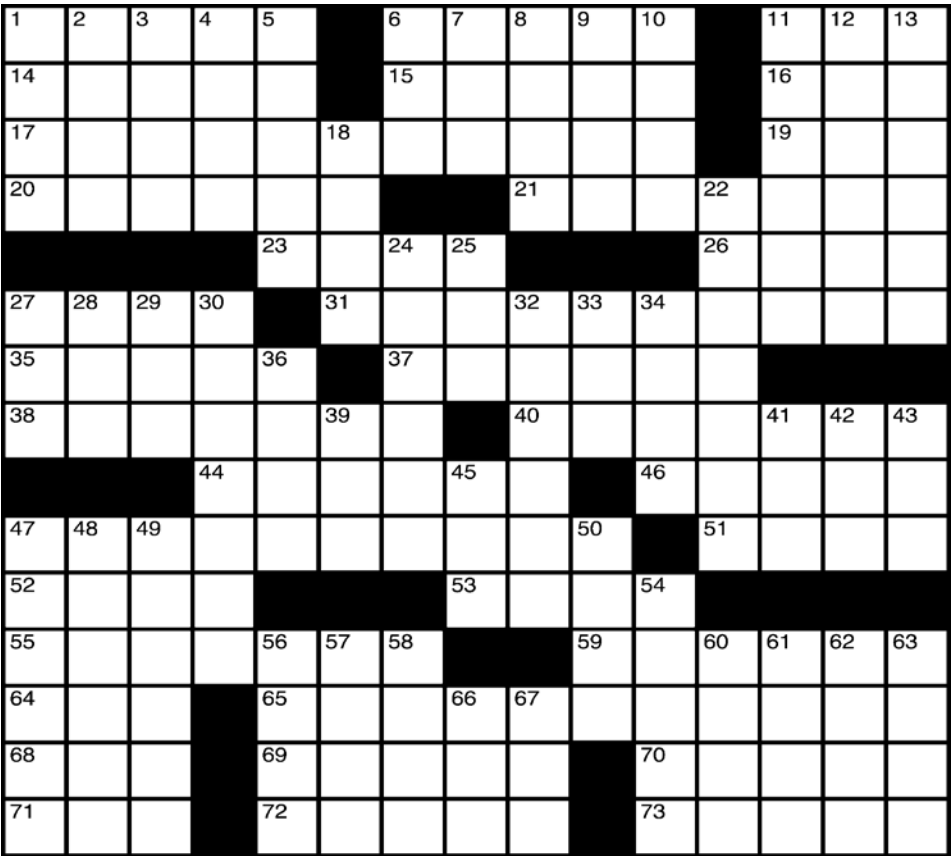

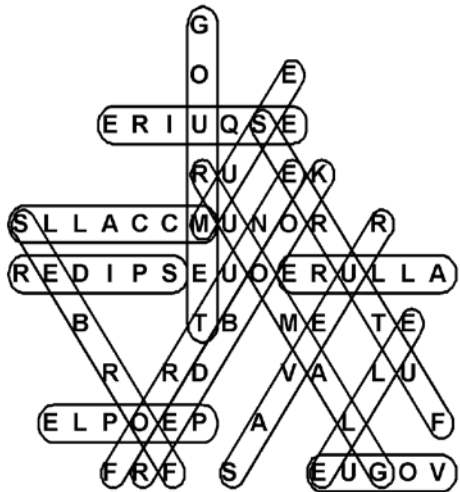

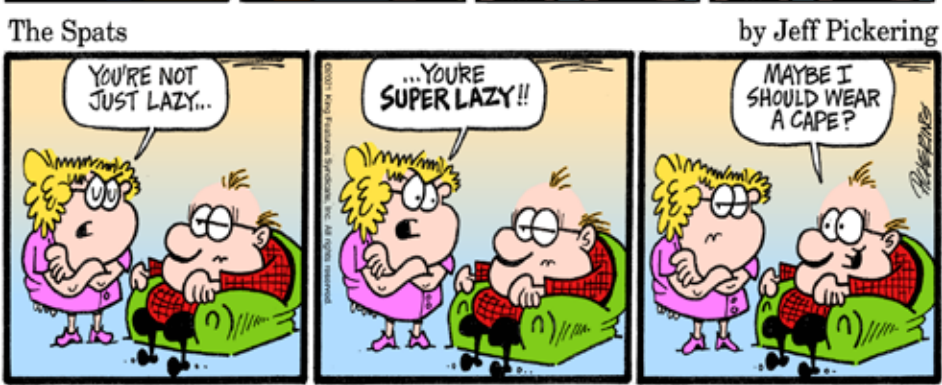
