Casinos.com Searches for Luck

Casinos.com analyzed 830,250 TripAdvisor reviews about 108 major U.S. casinos, searching for “20 luck and reward-related keywords”—luck, lucky, jackpot, hand pay, bonus, won, etc. They found 137,176 citations of the keywords, then refined and adjusted the survey through a statistical technique (based on Bayes’ Theorem) to account for anomalies. Phew. Anyway, the casino that earned the top spot as luckiest for players was Seminole Hard Rock Tampa, which garnered 323.6 luck mentions per 1,000 reviews out of 1,869 reviews). That was followed by Parx Casino in Pennsylvania (322.6 per with 2,066 reviews) and South Point (318.6 with 6,562 reviews). The Palms placed 10th (279.3 with 4,548 reviews). The bottom five were all on the Strip: Caesars (#104), Mandalay Bay, Excalibur, Bellagio, and Luxor (#108). Of course, as the survey notes, a “huge” proportion of their tens of thousands of reviews on TripAdvisor don’t mention gambling at all and focus instead on rooms, restaurants, shows, pools, and of course resort fees.

Surveying Sports Betting

Though prediction markets get most of the ink around sports betting nowadays, sometimes the exploding industry itself garners some attention. A crop of recent stories is a case in point. First, a new national poll finds more Americans oppose sports betting than approve of it. An Overton Insights survey on political and public-policy issues queried nearly 1,400 people about their opinions on sports

betting and overall, 47% were opposed, 31% were in support, and 22% didn’t know (or didn’t care). Next, an opinion piece on Futurism.com delves into the latest college sports betting scandal: the Texas Tech star quarterback’s suspension over “hundreds of bets worth \$90,000, including on games he was playing in.” The conclusion is in the headline: “Sports Betting Scandals Are Tearing College Football Apart.” Finally, there’s the spectacle of UFC Freedom 250 (a.k.a. UFC White House), the mixed martial arts event held on the South Lawn of the White House. Obviously, this is the first time the White House has ever hosted a wagering event,

\$18 Billion Bid for MGM Resorts

On the heels of billionaire Tilman Fertitta’s so-far successful buyout of Caesars Entertainment, billionaire media mogul Barry Diller has tendered a bid to buy MGM Resorts. Diller’s company, People Inc., already owns 26.1% of the stock, having invested in MGM steadily over the past six years. Calling the company “wildly undervalued,” Diller has offered to buy the other 74% at a 10% premium on the most recent closing price (which is up 15% this morning on the news).

Gold Spike Changes Hands

The Gold Spike, once Las Vegas’ ultimate downtown dive, made the news back in 2017 when Tony Hsieh bought it for \$27 million, eliminated the casino, and (tried to) turn it into a “nightlife and entertainment destination, featuring live music, special events, bars, lounges, and arcade-style games,” as we wrote at the time. Under Hsieh’s benign neglect approach, not much happened. Now, the Gold Spike has been sold again to two local real estate investors for \$11.4 million, around 40% of what Hsieh paid for it. The sale,

according to the *Review-Journal*, includes the “Gold Spike entertainment complex,” the adjacent Oasis hotel, and the parking lot. No word on what the developers’ plans might be for the property.

Lucky Lotto

Retired Driver Wins Big

Gary MacDonald won a £5.2 million (\$6.9 million) lottery last year and decided to quit his longtime job as a delivery man in Essex, U.K. Before Gary, 61, had his life-changing win, he delivered packages to stores in the Lakeside Shopping Center for over 30 years. “It’s been a crazy 12 months, from discovering I’d won a £5.2m Lotto jackpot and starring in the Lotto TV ad, to getting married and moving house,” he said, according to *The Independent*. Now, Gary jokes that becoming a millionaire “is turning out to be a full-time occupation.” Even with his new money, he still hasn’t forgotten where he started. “That said, I’m delighted to come out of retirement for the day to fulfil the promise I made myself,” he said. He decided to surprise his old coworkers by bringing them bouquets of flowers and their own lottery tickets. Gary said that he feels he’s “done a brilliant job” with the surprise and “spreading the joy with today’s deliveries.”

April Fools Win Confuses Family

A man was surprised when he realized he won big playing the lottery, but he says that some members of his family still might not be convinced that the prize is for real. Last year, Perry Pendleton, 70, of Maybee, Michigan, bought some Super Raffle tickets at a local Kroger store, then stored them in a box for safekeeping for nearly five months, according to a news release from local

lottery officials. “I bought five Super Raffle tickets over the course of a few weeks and put them in a box since the drawing was a few months out,” Pendleton says. As it turned out, he actually picked up more than one prize during the Nov. 19 drawing. “One of the tickets was a \$100 winner and then to my surprise, one came up as a \$100,000 winner! I thought to myself: ‘Is this real?’” Pendleton recalled. “I had to check the ticket three or four more times after that.” Pendleton went on to admit that since he waited until April 1 to tell some of his family members about his big win, there’s a chance they didn’t think he was telling them the truth. “I’m still not sure if they know it’s real,” he quipped. “If not, they are about to!” As for what he plans to do with the money, Pendleton said he already has some ideas. “With my winnings, I plan to save some, share some, and spend some, in that order,” he said.

Winner Waits to Tell Husband

A Kentucky mom won what she calls a “life-changing” prize playing an instant lottery game—though it took her some time to relay the good news to her family. The Jefferson County woman, who is remaining anonymous, decided to play the new Bank Boost game after receiving \$20 in Bonus Bucks from the Kentucky Lottery, according to lottery officials. Having read the rules, she said, knew something big was happening when a square popped up onscreen. She won a whopping \$900,392.68. It took her half an hour to share the good news with her husband, who was home with her at the time. “I just sat there in my office trying to breathe,” the woman recalled. Eventually, she confirmed her victory through a confirmation email. She then told her husband and daughter,

Now some of those items are once again not in stock, but for the most part they are. And now we have extra in our kitchen cabinets. It’s time to look at expiration dates and consider the reality: Will we really use up four boxes of pasta in the next month before they expire? If not, perhaps they could be donated to the food bank.

If grocery prices are going to keep rising and rising, this is one way to fight back.

Volunteering at the VA

The Department of Veterans Affairs just celebrated its 80th year of using volunteers to run programs for veterans. Last year alone, 46,000 volunteers worked 4.4 million service hours and gave \$108 million worth of gifts and donations.

We can make this year even better.

Go to Voluntary Services at www.volunteer.va.gov and see how you can help. On the left side look at Volunteer or Donate Now. Pick your state and the facility you want to support.

If you want to donate money, you can do that online with a credit card. Be sure to identify the facility you’d like the money to go to.

If you want to volunteer in person, select the facility and check the list for slots that need filled. It might be parking-lot shuttle driver, mealtime companion, maintenance help or any type of service. If the facility has a hospice unit, look at the list and consider the families that are staying there.

If you’re a member of a service organization such as the American Legion and want to make a group donation, look at the list of wish items they need. Right now at my medical facility, they’re looking for store gift cards, sneakers, underwear, canteen coupon books and gas cards. Other facility lists are more specific, down to the actual size of pants and shoes that are needed or the type of paperback books that are preferred.

If there is a large homeless population in your area, facilities often try to put together care packages for those veterans or apartment start-up kits for those moving into housing.

Call the Voluntary Services department at a facility near you and ask how you can help.



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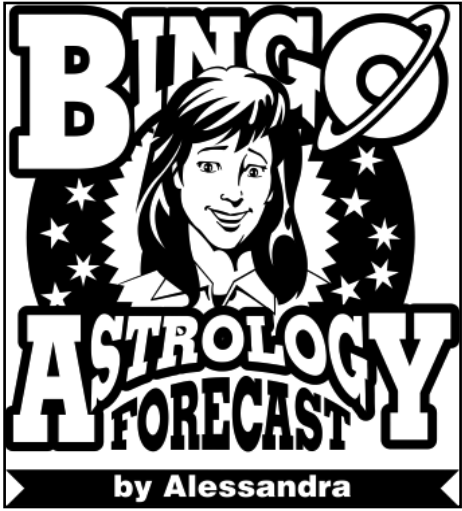

WalkBike Bingo in Iowa

According to the organization, the bingo card features 24 birds that participants can spot around the city. Birdwatchers can mark off each bird they see with an “X,” check mark or other symbol. Completing a row in any direction earns a bingo. Participants who complete their card will receive a free Texas Bird Bingo sticker. To claim the prize, completed cards must be emailed to the address listed on the card along with the participant’s name and email. Two participants will also be randomly selected to win a half-day Hill Country excursion. Discover Victoria is also hosting a drawing for bingo players. To be entered into the Discover Victoria drawing, fill out the link and submit a photo of your card on the website. The bingo card is available for download online or can be picked up at the Discover Victoria Texas Information Center.

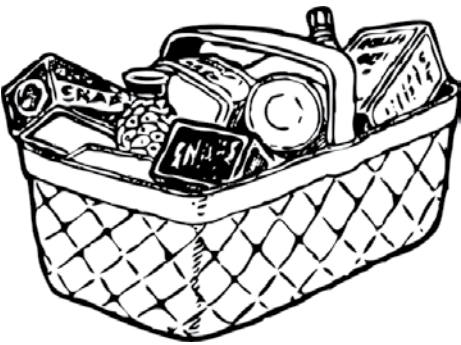
