WalkBike Bingo in Iowa

Iva and her younger sister were among the participants who completed a bingo card by taking part in a variety of active transportation challenges. Activities included smiling at someone while on a walk, biking to a destination instead of driving and performing the "ABC" bicycle safety check before riding. According to Iva's mother, Margareta Maxon, the challenge encouraged the family to get their bikes and helmets ready for summer and reinforced that walking or biking to destinations often takes little more time than driving. 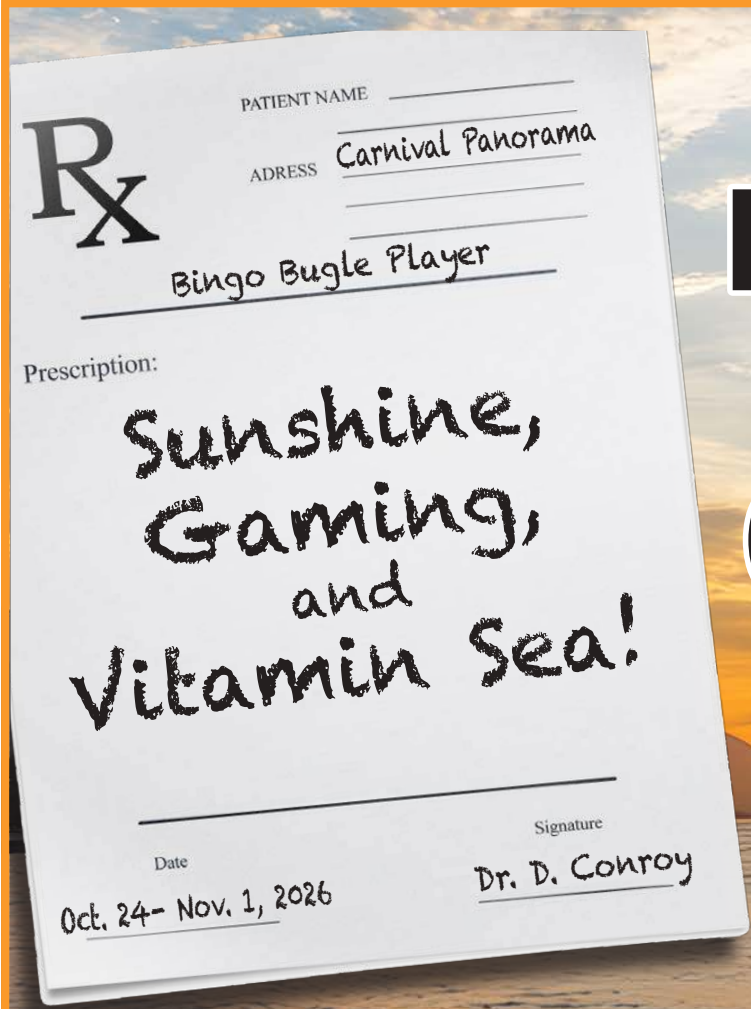

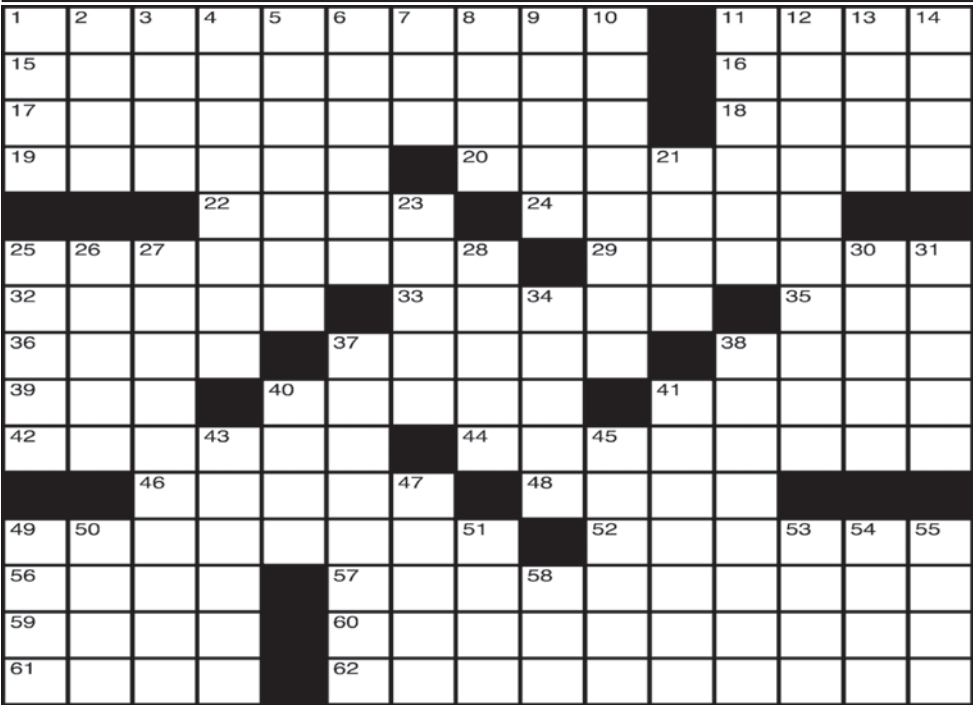
