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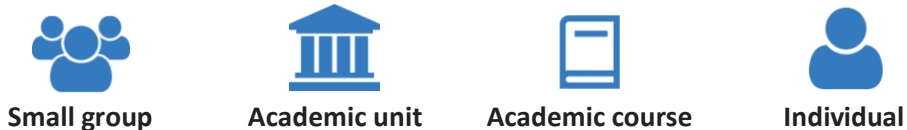
Introduction

The Lausanne Global Classroom is designed to connect emerging evangelical leaders to key issues and ideas in global mission today. As these leaders grow into national, regional, and global influence, our hope is that they will be equipped and knowledgeable for the work of mission in their generation through this resource.

This Classroom episode is on Workplace Ministry. In June of 2019 in Manila, Philippines, the Lausanne Global Workplace Forum brought together more than 900 workplace leaders from around the world to discuss how the workplace can function as a place of outreach and ministry. The workplace has greatly changed in recent history. It is therefore important to redeem and reclaim the whole area of work, vocation, and ministry in all areas of life through affirming the people of God as prophets, priests, and kings in their vocations and occupations from Monday to Saturday. This affirmation essentially equips every believer to live and serve as a full-time servant and ambassador of Jesus Christ in everyday living, breaking down the sacred-secular divide that is so pervasive in Christian culture. This episode examines the impact and effect that Christians can and should have in the workplace, how the Bible supports this notion, and how the church can support and encourage Christian workers through inspiring leaders, organizations, and movements to understand the importance of workplace ministry to global evangelization.

Global Classroom episodes are short videos in documentary format totaling 45-60 minutes, designed to give a broad introduction to the subject of the episode. The short video sections may be viewed all at once, or section-by-section at the discretion of the group leader or instructor. The Video Introduction page in the User Guide may help you to determine which section is most appropriate for your use and/or where to stop the video to facilitate reflection and discussion.

Additionally, each episode has a User Guide, which builds on the topics introduced in the video. The User Guide contains curriculum for four tracks: 1) small group settings, such as a ministry staff meeting or a mission-minded discussion group; 2) an academic unit as part of a course; 3) a semester-long academic course; and 4) an individual setting for those personally seeking missiological content that is current and globally representative. Syllabus for an Academic Unit

Global Classroom: Workplace Ministry

This syllabus can be used as a unit in a class on ministry, missions, global issues, etc. See the Syllabus for an Academic Course below for a full semester directed-study course.

Purpose

To introduce the concept of the workplace as an important factor in global evangelization and discipleship, and to lay a biblical and theological foundation for it. To give students a strategy for ministry in the workplace. To help students understand how the church and its leaders can encourage and strengthen workplace ministry and witness for Christ to the world.

Outcomes

After viewing the Lausanne Global Classroom episode on Workplace Ministry and completing the accompanying readings, discussion, and assignments, students will:

- Understand what constitutes workplace ministry and how it impacts global evangelization.
- Develop a biblical and theological understanding of workplace ministry.
- Understand the strategies and challenges of workplace ministry.
- Understand the changing global workplace and adapt ministry to and through it.
- Identify ways the church can strengthen and enhance workplace ministry.

Assignments

Choose from the assignments below.

1. Write an essay or essays answering selected discussion questions from above based on the video.
2. Write an essay or essays answering selected discussion questions from above based on the articles.
3. Show the Lausanne Global Classroom episode on Workplace Ministry to a group in your church, school, or community. The student should lead a discussion afterward using the video discussion questions above.
4. Write a 5-page response paper to each of the books suggested in the materials section above. In your paper(s), discuss how each book is significant for you and for a biblical and theological understanding of workplace ministry. Outline how the book changes the way you think about workplace ministry. What will change in your life and ministry after reading this book?

5. Design a short survey that includes questions on Christians in the workplace. Interview several people who are Christians concerning how they live out faith in their workplace. Write a 3-page descriptive reflection report discussing your experience and observations. Suggest ways Christians can enhance and strengthen witness in the workplace from your findings.

Syllabus for an Academic Course

Global Classroom: Workplace Ministry

This syllabus can be used for a semester-long directed study course on workplace ministry. The student(s) should meet with the instructor for three-to-four 1-hour sessions during the course to discuss the readings, assignments, and projects.
