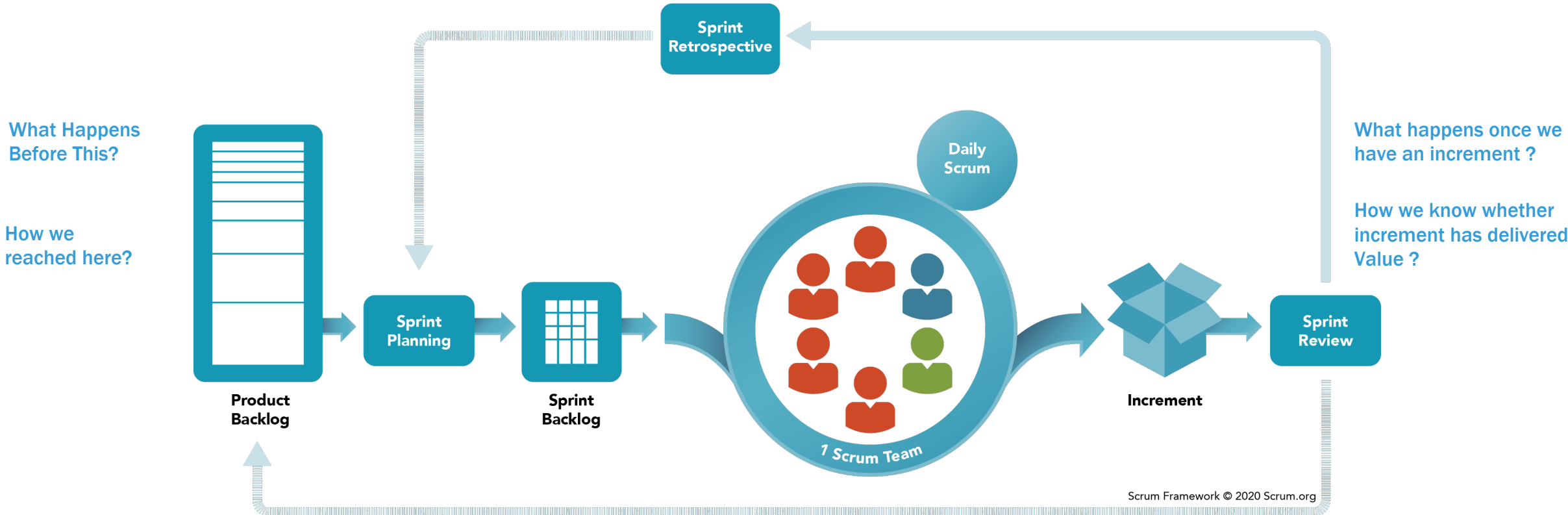
The Scrum framework is **purposefully incomplete**, only defining the parts required to implement Scrum theory.

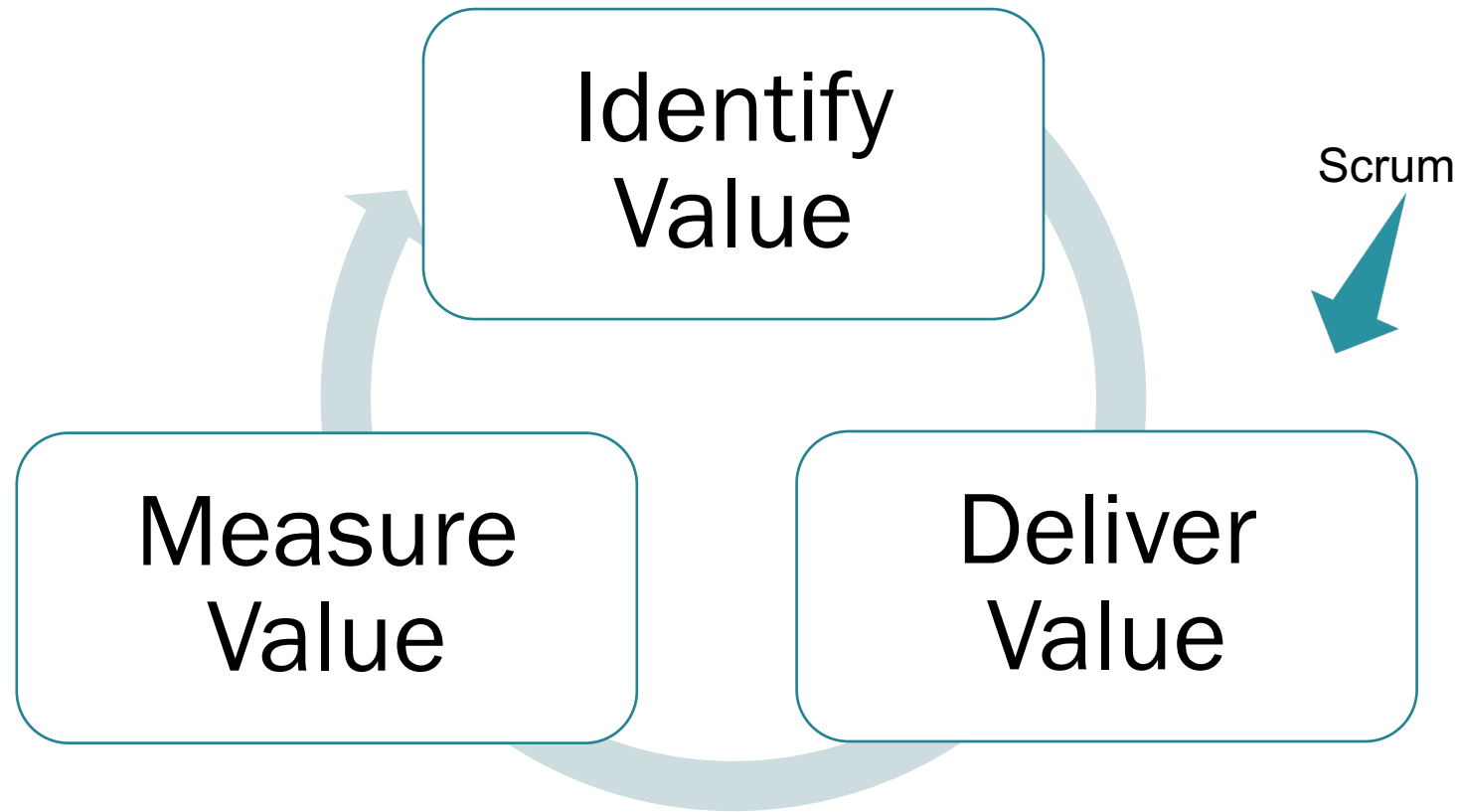

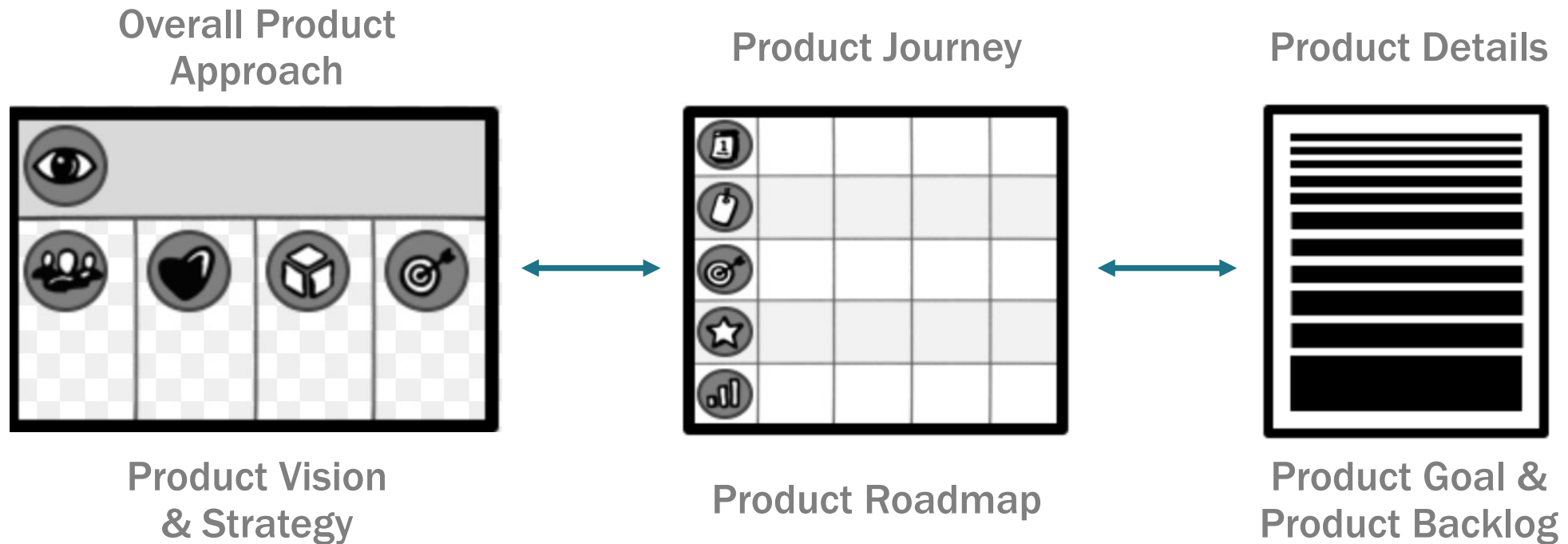

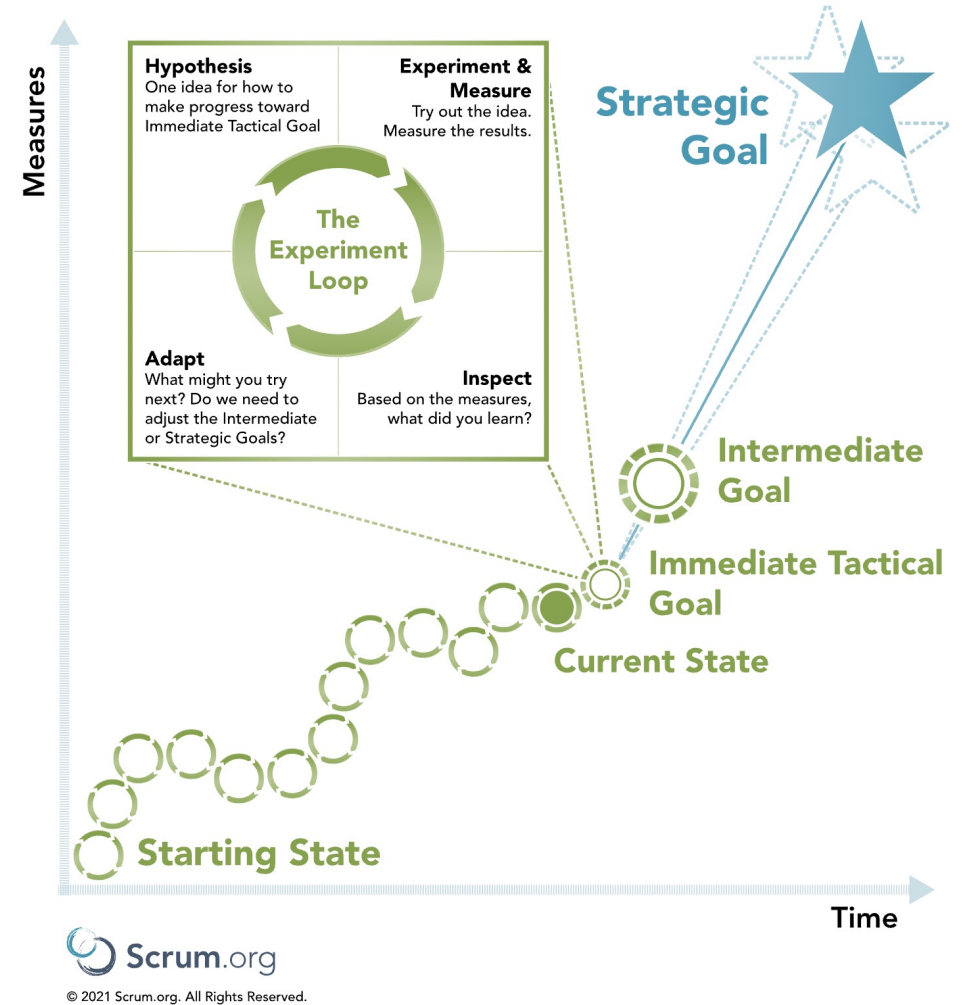
- Build the Learning culture thorough Experiments

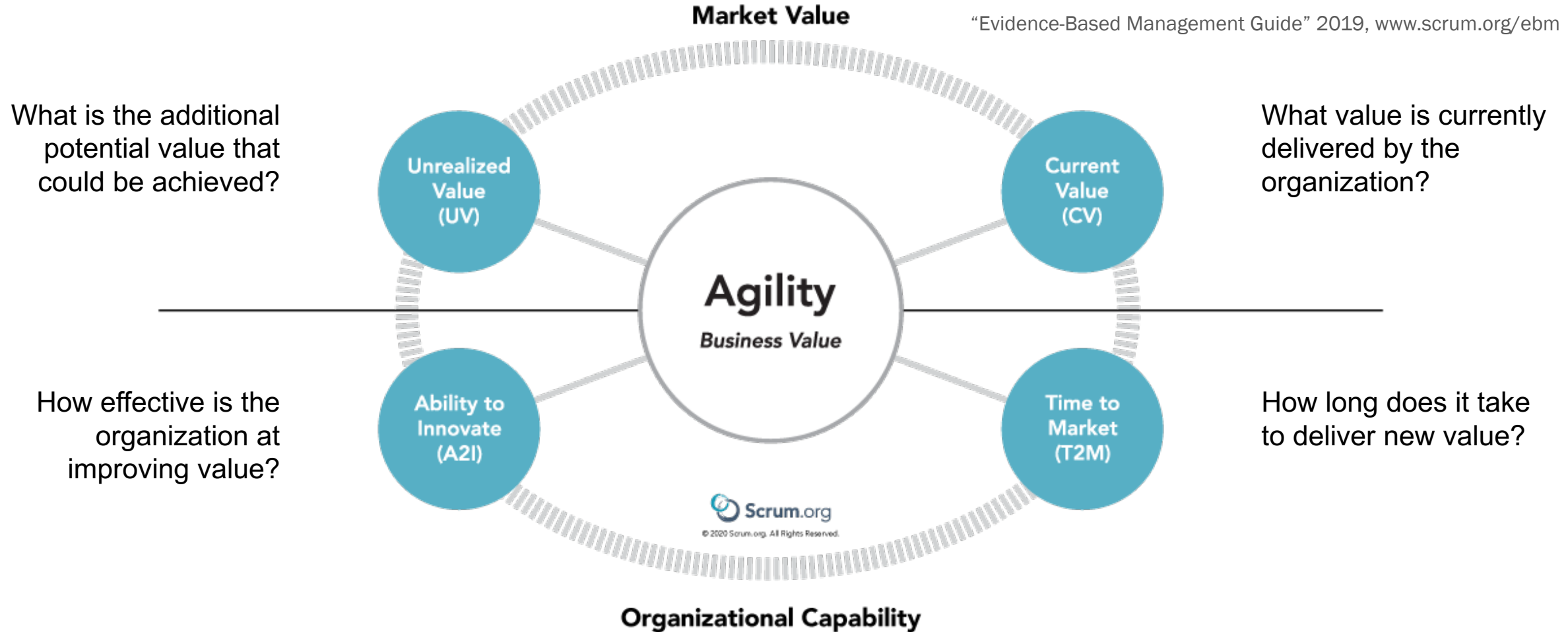

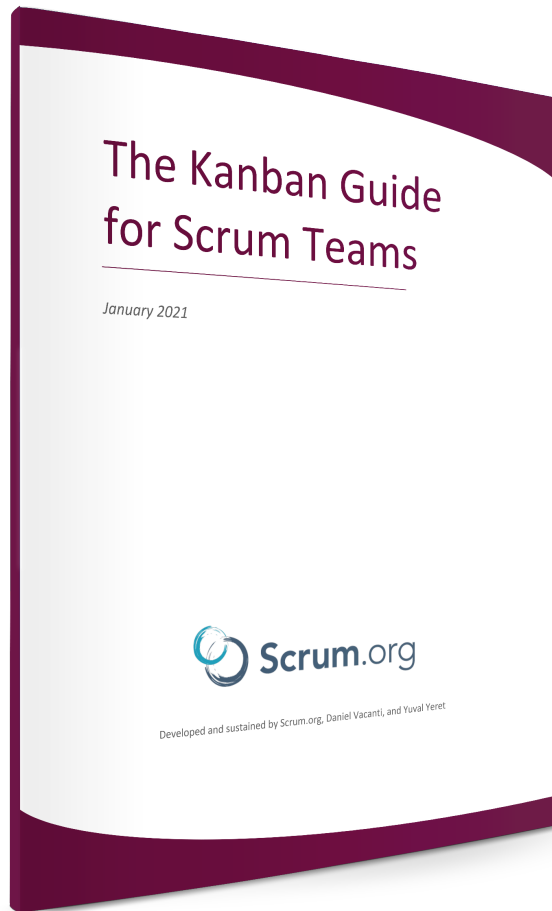

What is Kanban in a Scrum Context

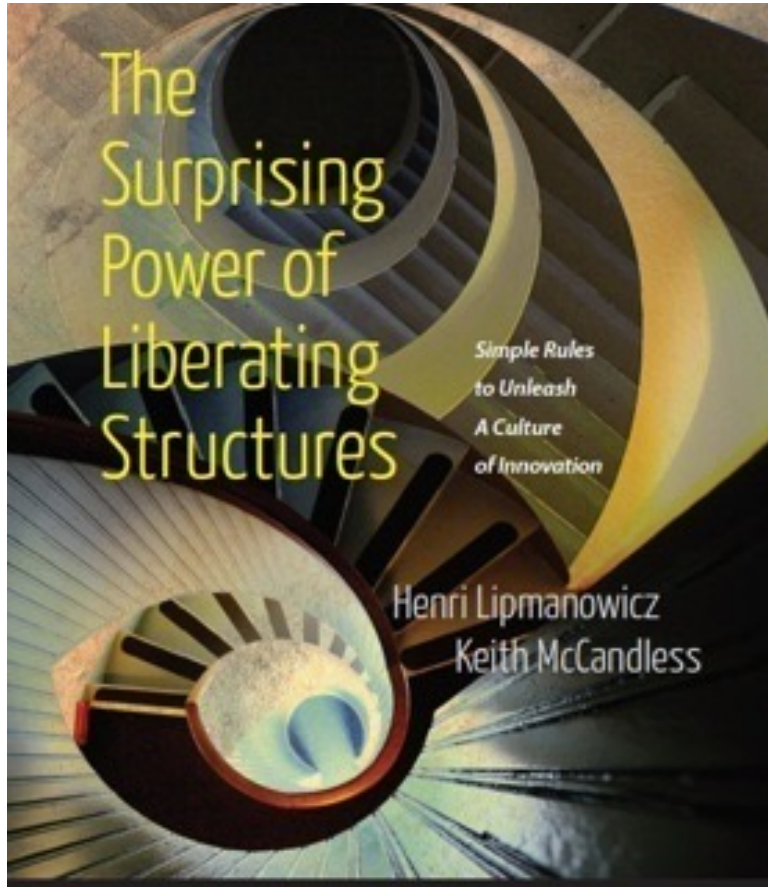


Kanban (n): a strategy for optimizing the flow of value through a process that uses a visual, work-in-progress limited pull system.

Kanban for Scrum Teams – Core Practices

1. Visualization of the Workflow
2. Limiting Work in Progress (WIP)
3. Active management of work items in progress
4. Inspecting and adapting the team's Definition of Workflow
