

A McHeard Moment:

You thought it would never happen to you. There you were minding your own business when the knock came to the door. There were people with balloons and a check announcing that you won seven thousand dollars a week for life! Wow...you never thought it would happen!

I wonder how many of God' people wish that they would "hit it big!" What about waiting? Why does it seem that the "rewards" or benefits that God promises only comes when we all get to heaven? Well, while some things are promised to children of God in heaven, plenty of wonderful things are available to God's children right now.

For instance, Children of God are promised God's presence with them forever. Two ways we see that made certain,

First, God promises to never leave us or forsake us (Psalm 46:10 and Hebrews 13:5). How wonderful it is that we can know that we are never forsaken of God. Secondly, God also promises to grant eternal life (Dan 12:2 and John 3:16). The gospel writer, John, affirms that those who have believed in Jesus HAVE (present tense) everlasting life. Daniel's prophesy affirms that some will be raised to everlasting life.

God promises to forgive sins (Psalm 103:10-14; Isa. 1:18 and Hebrews 8:12; 1 John 1:9). The passage in Isaiah is of particular interest.

Isaiah 1:18 (RSV18 "Come now, let us reason together, says the LORD: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool.

Imagine having on an all-white suit or dress, only to have red dye splashed and sprayed all over your outfit. Suppose all the oxyclean and bleach on the market was unable to take away the stain. Now imagine that someone suggested to you to dip your stain ridden garment on a bowl of blood.

How ridiculous, you think? Imagine your surprise to find that the blood not only took away the red dye and all of its effects, but it also whitens your garment brighter than any fullers soap or laundry facility could.

Thankfully, the child of God does not have to use his or her imagination in such a scenario. One of the precious promises of God is that the Blood of Jesus Christ, His son, cleanses us from all sin. Though our sin might be as scarlet, they shall be white as snow

So, what is the Labor Day Holiday all about?

Labor Day is a <u>federal holiday in the United States</u> celebrated on the first Monday in September to honor and recognize the <u>American labor movement</u> and the works and contributions of <u>laborers</u> to the development and achievements of the United States.

Beginning in the late 19th century, as the <u>trade union</u> and <u>labor movements</u> grew, diverse groups of trade unionists chose a variety of days on which to celebrate labor. In the United States, a September holiday called Labor Day was first proposed in the early 1880s.

According to one early history of Labor Day, the event originated in connection with a General Assembly of the Knights of Labor convened in New York City in September 1882. In connection with this clandestine Knights assembly, a public parade of various labor organizations was held on September 5 under the auspices of the Central Labor Union (CLU) of New York. Secretary of the CLU Matthew Maguire is credited for first proposing that a national Labor Day holiday subsequently be held on the first Monday of each September in the aftermath of this successful public demonstration.

An alternative theory maintains that the idea of Labor Day was the brainchild of <u>Peter J. McGuire</u>, a vice president of the <u>American Federation of Labor</u>, who, after a visit to <u>Toronto</u> where he saw parades celebrating labor that May, had put forward the initial proposal in the spring of 1882. According to McGuire, on May 8, 1882, he made a proposition to the fledgling Central Labor Union in New York City that a day be set aside for a "general holiday for the laboring classes". According to McGuire he further recommended that the event should begin with a street parade as a public demonstration of organized labor's solidarity and strength, with the march followed by a picnic, to which participating local unions could sell tickets as a fundraiser. According to McGuire he suggested the first Monday in September as an ideal date for such a public celebration, owing to optimum weather and the date's place on the calendar, sitting midway between the <u>Fourth of July</u> and <u>Thanksgiving</u> public holidays.

In 1909, the American Federation of Labor convention designated the Sunday preceding Labor Day as "Labor Sunday", to be dedicated to the spiritual and educational aspects of the labor movement. This secondary date failed to gain significant traction in popular culture, although some churches continue to acknowledge it.

The popularity of the event spread across the country. In 1887, <u>Oregon</u> became the first state of the United States to make Labor Day an official <u>public holiday</u>. By 1894, thirty <u>U.S. states</u> were already officially celebrating Labor Day. In that year, <u>Congress</u> passed a bill recognizing the first Monday of September as Labor Day and making it an official <u>federal holiday</u>. President Grover Cleveland signed the bill into law on June 28. The federal law, however, only made it a holiday for federal workers. As late as the 1930s, unions were encouraging workers to strike to make sure they got the day off. All U.S. states, the <u>District of Columbia</u>, and the <u>United States territories</u> have subsequently made Labor Day a statutory holiday. Labor Day became a federal holiday shortly after the <u>Pullman Strike</u>.



Matthew 11:28-30




